

The Hindu Vocabulary: 03.11.2023

1-Veritable (adjective): formal true or real —used to emphasize a description

Synonyms: authentic, genuine, real Antonyms: doubtful, dubious, equivocal

Sentence: The area is a veritable paradise for those who love walking

2-Voluminous (adjective): of a size greater than average of its kind

Synonyms: big, large, bulky

Antonyms: dinky, dwarf, little

Sentence: The voluminous report has been sent to council.

3-Consonance (noun): agreement or compatibility between opinions or actions.

Synonyms: agreement, concord, accord

Antonyms: discordance, disproportion, disunity

Sentence: These results are consonance with human's experiences.

4-Revanchism (noun) :a policy of seeking to retaliate, especially to recover lost

territory.

Synonyms: revenge, vengeance, reprisal

Sentence: But we also know that revanchism is never-ending.

5-Buzzword (noun): a word or phrase, often an item of jargon, that is fashionable at

a particular time or in a particular context.

Sentence: The latest buzzword in international travel is "ecotourism".

6-Vibrancy (noun): the state of being full of energy and life.

Synonyms: active, vibrant, exuberance

Antonyms: inactivity, lifelessness, laziness

Sentence: She was a woman with extraordinary vibrancy and extraordinary knowledge.

Mahendra's: Your Success is our Success

7-Offing (noun): time that is to come

Synonyms: by-and-by, future, hereafter

Antonyms: past, posterity

Sentence: Major changes are in the offin for the company.

8-Interlocutor (noun): a person who takes part in a dialogue or conversation.

Synonyms: dialogist, conversationalist, speaker

Sentence: Abraham was able to act as interpreter and interlocutor for our group.

9-Jaded (adjective): tired, bored, or lacking enthusiasm, typically after having had

too

much of something.

Synonyms: exhausted, fatigued, knackered

Antonyms: active, energetic, invigorated

Sentence: You look very jaded; you need a holiday.

10-Avouchment (noun): a solemn and often public declaration of the truth or

existence of something

Synonyms: declaration, assertion, claim

Antonyms: dispute, question

Sentence: Your avouchment of his good intentions means he won't be disciplined.
