



## The Hindu Vocabulary: 06.01.2024

### 1. RESISTANCE (NOUN)

**Meaning:** the act or power of opposing or withstanding something, whether it be a force, influence, action, or pressure.

**Synonyms:** Opposition, defiance, resilience, opposition, refusal, reluctance.

**Antonyms:** Compliance, submission, acceptance, acquiescence.

**Sentence:** The resistance of the material to high temperatures makes it suitable for aerospace applications.

### 2. NEGATE (VERB)

**Meaning:** To nullify, deny the existence or truth of, or make ineffective.

**Synonyms:** cancel, invalidate, counteract, annul, contradict..

**Antonyms:** Affirm, confirm, validate, support, uphold.

**Sentence:** The new evidence presented in court seemed to negate the previous witness's testimony.

### 3. OBNUBILATE (VERB)

**Meaning:** to cloud, obscure, or darken something, either literally or figuratively.

**Synonyms:** Cloud, obscure, blur, veil, muddle.

**Antonyms:** Clarify, illuminate, reveal, uncover.

**Sentence:** The dense fog began to obnubilate the landscape, making it difficult to see more than a few feet ahead.

#### 4. MORBIDITY (NOUN)

**Meaning:** the state of being diseased or the incidence or prevalence of disease within a population.

**Synonyms:** Sickness, illness, disease, unhealthiness.

**Antonyms:** Healthiness, wellness, vitality.

**Sentence:** The public health officials were concerned about the high morbidity rate in the region due to the outbreak.

#### 5. STINT (NOUN)

**Meaning:** a stint refers to a period of time spent doing a particular job or activity. It can also refer to a specific, limited quantity or amount of something..

**Synonyms:** Period, duration, spell, assignment, job, task.

**Antonyms:** Infinity, eternity, abundance, excess.

**Sentence:** After completing his stint as an intern, he was offered a full-time position with the company.

#### 6. BRIMMED (Adjective)

**Meaning:** something that is filled to the top or overflowing. .

**Synonyms:** Overflowing, filled to the top, full, packed.

**Antonyms:** Empty, vacant, depleted, unfilled

**Sentence:** Her eyes brimmed with tears as she listened to the touching story.

## 7. FATED (Adjective)

**Meaning:** Fated describes something that is destined or predetermined to happen, often with a sense of inevitability or preordained outcome.

**Synonyms:** Predestined, destined, predetermined, ordained, inevitable, inescapable.

**Antonyms:** Random, accidental, unforeseen, chance.

**Sentence:** Their encounter seemed fated, as if destined by some higher force.

## 8. CULMINATE (NOUN)

**Meaning:** to reach the highest point or climax of a process or event, often resulting in a significant outcome or conclusion.

**Synonyms:** Conclude, climax, peak, finish, conclude.

**Antonyms:** Begin, initiate, start, commence..

**Sentence:** The intense training sessions culminated in a successful performance at the competition.
