



## 1. DUBIOUS

**Parts of Speech: ADJ.**

**Meaning:** Hesitating or doubting; not to be relied upon; questionable or suspect.

**Synonyms:** Doubtful, uncertain, questionable, suspicious.

**Antonyms:** Certain, unquestionable, reliable.

**Sentence:** Given the dubious nature of the evidence, the jury had difficulty reaching a verdict in the trial.

## 2. UNANIMOUS

**Parts of Speech: ADJ.**

**Meaning:** Fully in agreement or showing complete accord; having the agreement or consent of all.

**Synonyms:** Unanimous, undisputed, agreed, united.

**Antonyms:** Divided, dissenting, disagreed.

**Sentence:** The decision to promote the candidate was unanimous among the members of the hiring committee.

## 3. DENOMINATION

**Parts of Speech: NOUN**

**Meaning:** A unit or value of currency; a category or group with shared characteristics, often used in religious, financial, or social contexts.

**Synonyms:** Category, group, sect, division, value.

**Antonyms:** Whole, entirety, undivided.

**Sentence:** The bank teller asked for the denomination of the currency the customer wanted, whether in twenties, fifties, or hundreds.

#### 4. SILOS

**Parts of Speech: NOUN**

**Meaning:** Refers to isolated or compartmentalized departments or groups within an organization that do not effectively communicate or collaborate with each other.

**Synonyms:** Departmentalization, compartmentalization.

**Antonyms:** Collaboration, integration, teamwork.

**Sentence:** The company struggled with silos as each department worked independently, hindering overall efficiency.

#### 5. MERELY

**Parts of Speech: ADVERB**

**Meaning:** Only, just, or simply; used to emphasize that something is no more than what is indicated.

**Synonyms:** Only, just, simply, solely.

**Antonyms:** Significantly, substantially, extensively.

**Sentence:** The changes in the new policy merely scratch the surface of the issues that need to be addressed.

#### 6. ALPHANUMERIC

**Parts of Speech: ADJ.**

**Meaning:** Involving or using a combination of letters and numbers.

**Synonyms:** Letter-number, alphanumeric characters.

**Antonyms:** Non-alphanumeric.

**Sentence:** The password policy requires users to create a strong, alphanumeric password with a combination of letters, numbers, and symbols.

## 7. STIPULATED

**Parts of Speech: VERB**

**Meaning:** To specify, demand, or arrange a condition or requirement as part of an agreement or contract.

**Synonyms:** Specify, demand, require, agree.

**Antonyms:** Waive, relinquish, surrender, neglect.

**Sentence:** The contract stipulated that the payment must be made within 30 days of the completion of the project.

## 8. DEFY

**Parts of Speech: VERB**

**Meaning:** To openly resist or refuse to obey; to challenge or confront with boldness.

**Synonyms:** Resist, challenge, oppose, disobey.

**Antonyms:** Obey, submit, comply, yield.

**Sentence:** The protesters decided to defy the curfew order and continued their march for justice through the night.

## 9. ANONYMOUS

**Parts of Speech: ADJ.**

**Meaning:** Without a known or disclosed identity; nameless or unidentified.

**Synonyms:** Unknown, unnamed, unidentified, incognito.

**Antonyms:** Known, identified, named, disclosed.

**Sentence:** The donation was made by an anonymous benefactor who wished to remain unrecognized.
