

## The Hindu Vocabulary: 17.12.2023

## 1. EXASPERATE (VERB): provoke

Synonyms: agitate, annoy

Antonyms: appease, pacify

Example Sentence:

He was exasperated by the continual interruptions.

2. DETERRENT (NOUN): restraint

Synonyms: disincentive, hindrance

Antonyms: assistance, help

**Example Sentence:** 

Nuclear deterrent does not necessarily create a sense of security for the people of the nation.

3. BOISTEROUS (ADJECTIVE): Noisy and mischievous

Synonyms: uproarious, raucous

Antonyms: moderate, solemn

**Example Sentence:** 

A boisterous crowd spoiled the market.

## 4. APPALLING (ADJECTIVE): horrifying

Synonyms: astounding, dreadful

Antonyms: delightful, pleasant

**Example Sentence:** 

Food victims are struggling to survive in appalling conditions in Orissa.

5. RAPPORT (NOUN): understanding between people

Synonyms: harmony, empathy

Antonyms: discord, incompatibility

Example Sentence:

We had a real good rapport with the company.

6. PUNITIVE (ADJECTIVE): concerning punishment

Synonyms: penal, retaliatory

Antonyms: beneficial, rewarding

Example Sentence:

Punitive methods are restricted in Montessori.

7. FALLACY (NOUN): illusion

Synonyms: deception, heresy

Antonyms: truth, accuracy

**Example Sentence:** 

People had fallacies about Chandraswami.

## 8. IMPROMPTU (ADJECTIVE): unrehearsed

Synonyms: offhand, spontaneous

Antonyms: deliberate, planned

**Example Sentence:** 

Dean explained to his stepfather Cynthia's impromptu trip to the shore after receiving Atherton's letter.

9. SOLECISM (NOUN): misuse

Synonyms: abuse, barbarism

Antonyms: accuracy, correctness

Example Sentence:

Students should not do any type of solecism with their teachers.

10. SOPORIFIC (ADJECTIVE): sleepy; sleep-inducing

Synonyms: anesthetic, calming

Antonyms: upsetting, conscious

**Example Sentence:** 

He is taking a soporific drug for his disease.
