



The Hindu Vocabulary: 22.11.2023

1-INDOMITABLE (ADJECTIVE): Incapable of being subdued, unconquerable, unbeatable, resilient, and fearless.

Synonyms: Resolute, Tenacious

Antonyms: Surrendering, Submissive

Sentence: Despite facing numerous challenges, her indomitable spirit and determination allowed her to overcome every obstacle in her path.

2-INVINCIBILITY(NOUN): the state or quality of being invincible, i.e., incapable of being conquered, overcome, or defeated.

Synonyms: Immortality, Resilience

Antonyms: Susceptibility, Fragility

Sentence: The superhero's invincibility made him the ultimate defender of the city, as he seemed impervious to any threat that came his way.

3-VANQUISHED(ADJECTIVE): Defeated thoroughly, conquered, or overcome.

Synonyms: Subdued, Overpowered

Antonyms: Conqueror, Overcomer

Sentence : The vanquished army retreated in disarray after the fierce battle.

4-SLUGGISH(ADJECTIVE): Lacking energy or slow in movement, response, or activity; lethargic, inactive, or showing a lack of vigour.

Synonyms: Torpid, Listless

Antonyms: Prompt, Zealous

Sentence: The hot weather made everyone feel sluggish, and even the most energetic individuals found it challenging to stay active during the heatwave.

5-BELLIGERENT(ADJECTIVE): Hostile, aggressive, Or inclined to fight.

Synonyms: Combative, Pugnacious

Antonyms: Amicable, Friendly

Sentence: The argument became increasingly belligerent, with both parties refusing to back down.

6-PLUMMET(VERB): To fall or drop rapidly and uncontrollably to decline sharply or plunge

Synonyms: Descend, Tumble

Antonyms: Soar, Increase

Sentence: The stock prices began to plummet after the negative financial report was released, causing concern among investors.

7-EMBODIMENT(NOUN): The tangible or visible form of an idea, quality, or concept; a concrete representation or example.

Synonyms: Epitome, Exemplification

Antonyms: Ethereality, Immaterialism

Sentence: The historic building was considered the embodiment of architectural excellence, showcasing the grandeur of a bygone era.
