# 1. PREVALENCE (NOUN)

**Meaning:** The condition of being widespread or common within a particular place, population, or situation.

Synonyms: Ubiquity, Pervasiveness

Antonyms: Infrequency ,Scarcity , Uncommonness

**Sentence:** The prevalence of smartphones in today's society is evident, with almost everyone owning a mobile device for communication and access to information.

#### 2. DESCENDENT (NOUN)

**Meaning:** A person, plant, or animal that is descended from a particular ancestor or group of ancestors. A descendant is a generation or individual that follows another in a line of genealogy.

Synonyms: Successor, Progeny, Scion.

Antonyms: Forebear, Predecessor, Ascendant

**Sentence:** The modern-day family reunion brought together descendants from various parts of the world, all sharing a common ancestry dating back to their great-grandparents.

## 3. LINEAGE (NOUN)

**Meaning:** A sequence of individuals or entities in the order of their birth or existence, especially within a family.

Synonyms: Genealogy ,Line of descent , Heritage

Antonyms: Disconnection ,Non-ancestry.

**Sentence:** The royal family proudly traced its lineage back several centuries, highlighting a rich history of monarchs and noble ancestors.

### 4. SEVERITY (NOUN)

**Meaning:** The quality or condition of being severe, harsh, strict, or intense. It can refer to the degree of seriousness or harshness of a situation, condition, or action.

Synonyms: Seriousness, Rigor, Sternness.

Antonyms: Leniency ,Lightness , Moderation

**Sentence:** The severity of the storm led to widespread damage, with strong winds and heavy rainfall causing flooding and destruction in many areas.

### **5. COMORBIDITIES (NOUN)**

**Meaning:** Refers to the presence of two or more medical conditions or diseases occurring simultaneously in an individual.

a person who holds a specific office or position.

Synonyms: Coexisting illnesses, Multiple health issues

Antonyms: Singular condition , Healthiness

**Sentence:** The patient's treatment plan had to address not only the primary ailment but also consider the comorbidities, such as diabetes and hypertension, to ensure comprehensive care.

# 6. CONSPICUOUS (Adjective)

**Meaning:** Easily noticeable or visible; attracting attention due to being prominent, obvious, or standing out.

Synonyms: Prominent ,Observable ,Evident.

Antonyms: Subtle ,Hidden , Unobtrusive.

**Sentence:** The new sculpture in the park was so conspicuous that it quickly became a landmark, drawing the attention of everyone who passed by.

## 7. ENVISAGE (verb)

**Meaning:** To contemplate or conceive of something in the mind; to visualize or foresee a future event or situation

Synonyms: Visualize ,Foresee ,Picturize

Antonyms: Ignore ,Disregard ,Neglect.

**Sentence:** As an architect, she could envisage the final design of the building even before the construction began, with every detail vividly pictured in her mind.

# 8. PROTRACTED (Adjective)

**Meaning:** Extended or prolonged in time; drawn out or lengthened, often implying that something continues for an unusually long period.

Synonyms: Extended , Prolonged , Lengthy

Antonyms: Concise , Abbreviated , Swift

**Sentence:** The negotiations between the two countries were protracted, lasting for months without reaching a resolution.

## 9. SEDITION (NOUN)

**Meaning:** The act of inciting rebellion or resistance against a government, often through speech, writing, or other forms of expression.

Synonyms: Treason, Insurrection

Antonyms: Loyalty , Compliance

**Sentence:** The political activist was arrested on charges of sedition after delivering a fiery speech that called for the overthrow of the government and the establishment of a new political order.

### **10. LYNCHING (NOUN & VERB)**

**Meaning:** To unlawfully execute someone, especially by a mob, without proper legal proceedings.

Synonyms: Execute, hang, mob justice

Antonyms: Pardon, acquittal

**Sentence:** The mob decided to take matters into their own hands and lynched the accused, bypassing the legal system altogether.
