**1. NAUSEOUS (ADJECTIVE): (वमनजनक): sickening**

**Synonyms:** nauseating, stomach-turning

**Antonyms:** charming

**Example Sentence:**

The thought of stale food made her feel nauseous.

**2. UPHEAVAL (NOUN): (उथल-पुथल): disruption**

**Synonyms:** upset, disturbance

**Antonyms:** stability

**Example Sentence:**

Major upheavals have affected the financial markets.

**3. INTENDED (ADJECTIVE): (जानबूझकर): deliberate**

**Synonyms:** intentional, calculated

**Antonyms:** accidental

**Example Sentence:**

The intended victim escaped.

**4. LAST (VERB): (सहन करना): endure**

**Synonyms: stand up, keep going**

**Antonyms: wear out**

**Example Sentence:**

**The car is built to last.**

**5. BRUTALITY (NOUN): (क्रूरता): savagery**

**Synonyms: cruelty, viciousness**

**Antonyms: gentleness**

**Example Sentence:**

**Brutality against civilians should be condemned.**

**6. CONVICT (VERB): (अपराधी घोषित करना): sentence**

**Synonyms: find guilty, send down for**

**Antonyms: acquit**

**Example Sentence:**

**The thieves were convicted of the robbery.**

**7. UNIVERSAL (ADJECTIVE): (सर्वव्यापक): general**

**Synonyms: ubiquitous, comprehensive**

**Antonyms: particular**

**Example Sentence:**

**His decision led to universal suffrage.**

**8. NUMEROUS (ADJECTIVE): (अनेक): many**

**Synonyms: a great many, countless**

**Antonyms: few**

**Example Sentence:**

**She had complained to the council on numerous occasions.**
