

The Supreme Court set aside the High Court decision November 22, 2019 upholding an overqualified candidate's claim to a job as peon in the bank. It noted that this candidate had deliberately not disclosed the fact that he was a graduate. It was known only later. Besides, the prescribed qualification for the job was Class XII pass. The Bank had a specific rule against appointing a graduate as peon.

"In the present case, prescribing the eligibility criteria/educational qualification that a graduate candidate shall not be eligible and the candidate must have passed 12th standard is justified. It was a **(T)** decision taken by the Bank in force since 2008. Therefore, the High Court has clearly erred," the Supreme Court observed.
