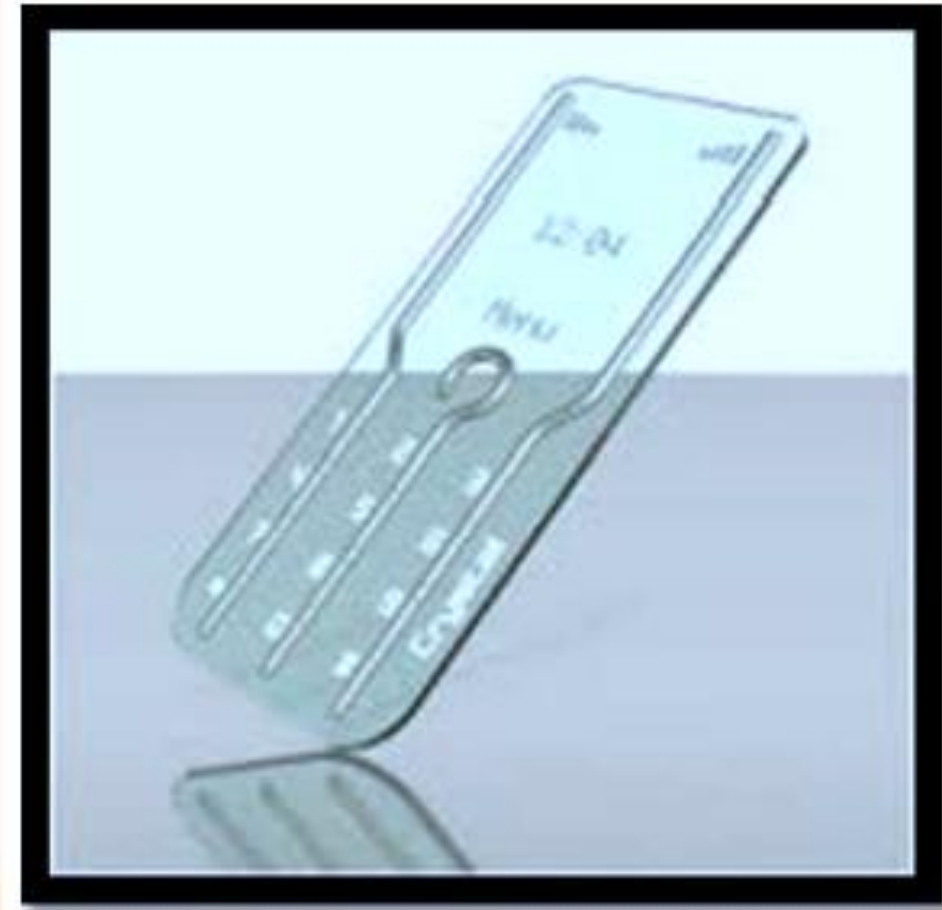


Enfeeble

Definition not used or cared for and in bad condition

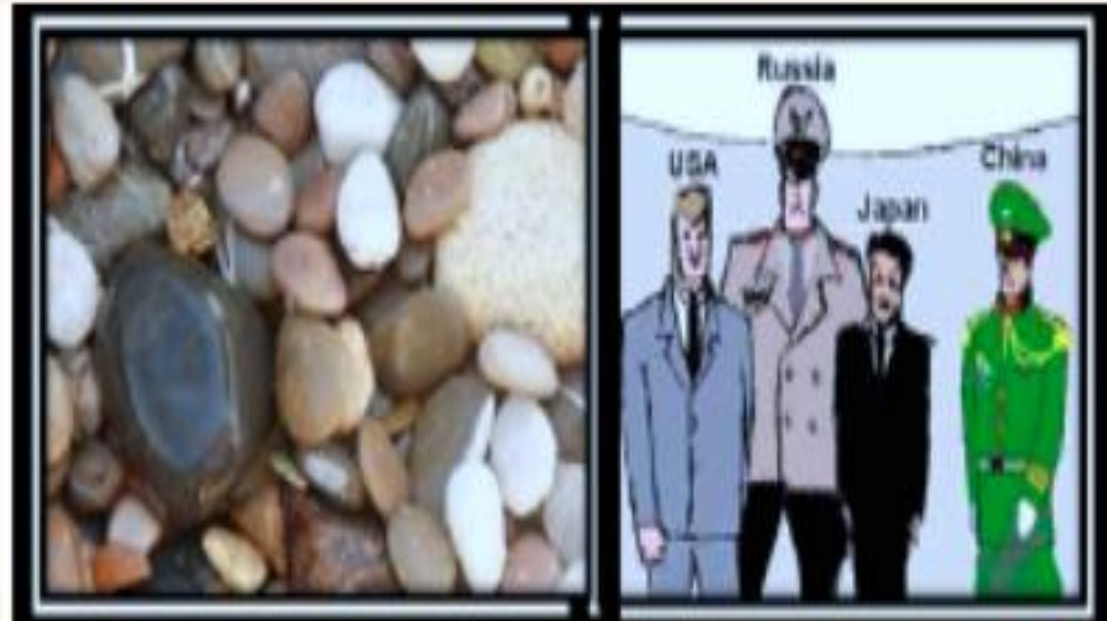
Demeaning

Definition a scene full of noise and confusion

Usage He is causing bedlam at the hotel.



Adjudge



Definition to make a decision about someone or something based on the facts that are available
