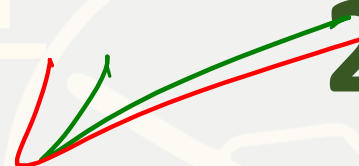

1) **Scurry (VERB)** (/ 'skʌri/) घबरा कर चलना, शीघ्र चलना
of a person or small animal) move hurriedly with short
quick steps. **EXAMPLE-** "pedestrians scurried for cover"
Similar: scamper, scuttle, bustle, hurry, hasten



2) Fluke¹ (NOUN) (/flu:k/) आकस्मिक लाभ, अनायास सफलता

an unlikely chance occurrence, especially a surprising piece of luck.

EXAMPLE- "their victory was a bit of a fluke"

Similar- coincidence, accident, lucky break

3) Teeter (VERB) (/ 'ti:tə/) डगमगाना, लड़खड़ाना

move or balance unsteadily; sway back and forth.

EXAMPLE- "she teetered after him in her high-heeled sandals"

Similar: totter, wobble, toddle, sway

4) Evasive (ADJ) (/i'veɪsɪv/) गोलमाल, छली, टालने वाला

tending to avoid commitment or self-revelation, especially by responding only indirectly.

EXAMPLE- "she was evasive about her phone number"

Similar: prevaricating, elusive, ambiguous, equivocal

5) Freakish (ADJ) (/ 'fri:kɪʃ/)

very unusual, strange, or unexpected.

EXAMPLE- "freakish weather"

Similar: peculiar, odd, bizarre, queer

6) Quixotic (ADJ) (/kwɪk'sɒtɪk/)

extremely idealistic; unrealistic and impractical.

EXAMPLE- "a vast and perhaps quixotic project"

SIMILAR- unworldly, unworkable, impossible, non-viable, inoperable

Similar: astuteness, acuteness, acumen, intelligence, wit,

8) Sheer¹ (ADJ) (/ʃiə/) निरा, पूर्णतया, सर्वथा

nothing other than; unmitigated (used for emphasis).

EXAMPLE- "she giggled with sheer delight"

Similar: utter, complete, absolute, total, pure, perfect, downright

9) Devious (ADJ) (/ˈdiːviəs/)

showing a skilful use of underhand tactics to achieve goals. **EXAMPLE-** "he's as devious as a politician needs to be"

Similar: deceitful, dishonest, immoral, unscrupulous,
fraudulent

Similar: rage, rant, thunder, storm, declaim, inveigh



2) Muffle (VERB) (/ˈmʌf(ə)l/)

make (a sound) quieter or less distinct.

EXAMPLE- "his voice was muffled"

Similar: deaden, dull, dampen, mute, hush

3) Rescind (VERB) (/ri'sind/) निरस्त करना, रद्द कर देना

evolve, cancel, or repeal (a law, order, or agreement).

Similar: revoke, repeal, cancel, abrogate, overturn,
overrule

EXAMPLE- No consent from any other party is required to vary or rescind this Agreement.

4) Plaudit (NOUN) (/ 'plɔ:dit/) शाबाशी, साधुवाद, बड़ाई

an expression of praise or approval.

EXAMPLE- "the network has received plaudits for its sports coverage" **Similar:** acclaim, acclamation, commendation, encomiums, approbation, accolades

5) Reprehensible (ADJ) (/ ,rɛprɪ'hɛnsɪb(ə)l/) निन्दनीय

Deserving censure or condemnation.

EXAMPLE- This behaviour is unacceptable and is morally reprehensible.

Similar: deplorable, disgraceful, discreditable,
disreputable, despicable

6) Tardy (ADJ) (/ˈtɑːdi/)

विलम्बी

delaying or delayed beyond the right or expected time; late.

Example- "please forgive this tardy reply"

Similar: late, unpunctual, behind time, behind schedule

Delayed

7) Obfuscate (VERB) (/ 'ɒbfʌskeɪt/) हैरान करना

bewilder (someone).

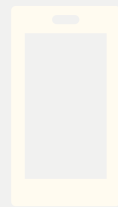
EXAMPLE- "the new rule is more likely to obfuscate people than enlighten them"

Similar: mystify, puzzle, perplex, baffle, confound,
bemuse

8) Eschew (VERB) (/is'tʃuː, ɛs'tʃuː/) **परहेज़ करना, से दूर रहना**

deliberately avoid using; abstain from.

EXAMPLE- "he appealed to the crowd to eschew violence"
Similar: abstain from, refrain from, forgo, shun, renounce



9) Ennui (noun) (on-wee) ऊब, थकान

a feeling of listlessness and dissatisfaction arising from a lack of occupation or excitement.

EXAMPLE- "he succumbed to ennui and despair"

Similar: boredom, tedium, lethargy, lassitude, languor

10) Lampoon (VERB) (/lam'pu:n/) व्यंग्य करना, मज़ाक उड़ाना, निन्दालेख लिखना

publicly criticize (someone or something) by using ridicule, irony, or sarcasm. **EXAMPLE-** "the actor was lampooned by the press" **Similar:** satirize, mock, ridicule, make fun of

EXAMPLE- "the teachers imparted a great deal of knowledge to their pupils"

Similar: communicate, pass on, convey, transmit, relay



2) Foist (VERB) (/fɔɪst/)

impose an unwelcome or unnecessary person or thing on.

EXAMPLE- "she had no desire to have an elderly relative foisted on her"

Similar: force, offload, unload, dump, palm off

3) Surmise (VERB) (/sə'mɪzɪz/) अनुमान करना, संदेह करना

suppose that something is true without having evidence to confirm it.

EXAMPLE- "he surmised that something must be wrong"

Similar: guess, conjecture, suspect, deduce, infer

4) Rue¹ (VERB) (/ru:/) पछताना, अफसोस करना

bitterly regret (something one has done or allowed to happen) and wish it undone.

EXAMPLE- She'll rue the day she bought that house.

Similar: regret, be sorry about, feel remorse for, repent of

5) Antediluvian (ADJ) (/ ,antɪdɪ'lu:vɪən/)

ridiculously old-fashioned.

EXAMPLE- My mother has some hopelessly antediluvian ideas about the role of women.

Similar: outdated, outmoded, ancient, antiquated

6) Blandish (VERB) (/ˈblændɪʃ/) चापलूसी करना

coax (someone) with kind words or flattery.

SIMILAR- cajole, coax, , wheedle

EXAMPLE- The senator felt it okay to blandish voters and used personal praises to try and win their favor.

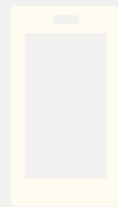
7) buffet² (VERB) (/ˈbʌfɪt/)

of difficulties) afflict (someone) over a long period.

EXAMPLE- "they were buffeted by a major recession"

Similar: trouble, distress, bother, beset, harass, worry, oppress



8) Lackadaisical (ADJ) (/ˌlakəˈdeɪzɪk(ə)l/) निरुत्साहपूर्ण

lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy.

EXAMPLE- Ramesh has a rather lackadaisical approach to his work.

Similar: careless, lax, uninterested, apathetic, languid, lethargic

9) Deprecate (verb) (/ 'dɛprɪkeɪt/) निन्दा करना, विरोध करना

express disapproval of.

EXAMPLE- "what I deprecate is persistent indulgence"

Similar: deplore, abhor, despise, execrate, criticize, censure, condemn, denounce

10) Dissemble (VERB) (/dɪ'semb(ə)l/)

conceal or disguise one's true feelings or beliefs.

EXAMPLE- "an honest, sincere person with no need to dissemble"

Similar: pretend, deceive, feign, masquerade, sham, bluff, counterfeit

Similar: succinct, pithy, short and to the point, thumbnail, compact, concise



2) Smug (ADJ) (/smʌg/) आत्मसन्तुष्ट, दंभी, अपने हाल में मस्त

having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements.

EXAMPLE- "he was feeling smug after his win"

Similar: self-satisfied, complacent, puffed up

3) Consternation (NOUN) (/kɒnstə'neɪʃ(ə)n/)

a feeling of anxiety or dismay, typically at something unexpected. / fear resulting from the awareness of danger

EXAMPLE- "to her consternation her car wouldn't start"

Similar: dismay, perturbation, anxiety, distress, disquiet

4) Loom² (VERB) (/lu:m/)

appear as a vague form, especially one that is large or threatening.

EXAMPLE- "vehicles loomed out of the darkness"

Similar: emerge, appear, become visible, come into view

5) Purvey (VERB) (/pə'veɪ/)

provide or supply (food, drink, or other goods) as one's business. **EXAMPLE-** "shops purveying cooked food"

Similar: sell, supply, provide, furnish, cater

6) Gnomic (ADJ) (/ 'nəʊmɪk/)

दुरूह

difficult to understand because enigmatic or ambiguous.

EXAMPLE- "I had to have the gnomic response interpreted for me"

SIMILAR- mysterious, puzzling, mystifying, inexplicable

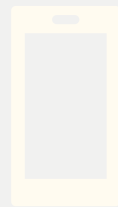
7) Brook² (VERB) (/brʊk/)

tolerate or allow (something, typically dissent or opposition).

EXAMPLE- "Jenny would brook no criticism of Matthew"

Similar: stand, bear, put up with, endure, suffer, withstand



8) Entail (VERB) (/ɪn'teɪl, ɛn'teɪl/)

involve (something) as a necessary or inevitable part or consequence.

EXAMPLE- "a situation which entails considerable risks"

Similar: necessitate, require, need, demand, call for

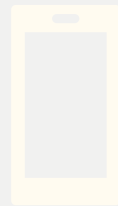
9) Enumerate (VERB) (/ɪˈnju:məreɪt/)

mention (a number of things) one by one./ specify individually

EXAMPLE- "there is not space to enumerate all his works"

Similar: list, itemize, catalogue, cite, name

10) Evoke (VERB) (/ɪˈvəʊk/)

bring or recall (a feeling, memory, or image) to the conscious mind.

EXAMPLE- "the sight evoked pleasant memories of his childhood"

SIMILAR- summon, invoke, elicit, induce, kindle

Similar: demolish, tear down, pull down, bulldoze, wipe out,

2) Foreboding (NOUN) (/fɔ: 'bæʊdɪŋ/)

a feeling that something bad will happen; fearful apprehension./ a feeling of evil to come,,,,,, अनिष्ट दर्शन, भविष्य की विपदाओ को पहिले से जान लेना

EXAMPLE- "with a sense of foreboding she read the note"

Similar: apprehension, anxiety, perturbation, trepidation

3) Vestigial (ADJ) (/vɛ'stɪdʒɪəl,)

forming a very small remnant of something that was once greater or more noticeable.

EXAMPLE- "he felt a vestigial flicker of anger from last night"

Similar: remaining, surviving, residual, leftover, lingering, persisting,,,,,,

4) Nab (VERB) (/nab/)

catch (someone) doing something wrong.

EXAMPLE- "they recently nabbed a burglar inside the house he was ransacking"

Similar: capture, apprehend, arrest

5) Oafish (ADJ) (/ 'əʊfɪʃ/) बेवकूफ़, भद्दा,

rough or clumsy and unintelligent./ ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance

EXAMPLE- He called me a stupid, oafish, little girl in front of EVERYONE the night I met him.

Similar: stupid, foolish, idiotic



6) Requisite (ADJ) (/ˈrɛkwɪzɪt/)

made necessary by particular circumstances or regulations.

EXAMPLE- "the application will not be processed until the requisite fee is paid"

Similar: required, prerequisite, essential, indispensable, vital

7) Forfeit (VERB) (/ˈfɔːfɪt/)

lose or give up (something) as a necessary consequence of something else.

EXAMPLE- "she didn't mind forfeiting an hour in bed to muck out the horses"

Similar: surrender, relinquish, part with, yield

8) Conviction (NOUN) (/kən'vɪkʃ(ə)n/) दृढ़ विश्वास, आस्था,

a firmly held belief or opinion.

EXAMPLE- "she takes pride in stating her political convictions"

Similar: view, thought, persuasion, idea

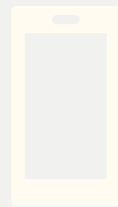

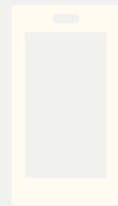

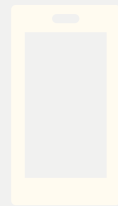




1) Rococo (ADJ) (/rə'kəʊkəʊ/)

आलीशान

(especially of music or literature) extravagantly or excessively ornate. **Similar:** ornate, curlicued, decorated, embellished, adorned, ornamented,,,,, **EXAMPLE-** The entrance rooms of the French castle were decorated in fancy rococo style.



2) Discombobulate (VERB) (/ ,diskəm' bɒbjʊleɪt/)

disconcert or confuse (someone). भ्रमित होना

EXAMPLE- I felt discombobulated after working twelve hours a day for seven straight days.

SIMILAR- befuddle, bewilder, confound, fluster, baffle

3) Jejune (ADJ) (/dʒɪ'dʒuːn/)

जीरस, Jeeray
Jull

naive, simplistic, and superficial.

EXAMPLE- I am very jejune and refuse to eat anything I cannot spell.

Similar: innocent, artless, guileless, unworldly, childlike

4) Cheeky (ADJ) (/ˈtʃiːki/)

showing a lack of respect or politeness in a way that is amusing or appealing.

EXAMPLE- Now don't be cheeky to your elders, young man.

Similar: impudent, impertinent, insolent,

5) Nonchalant (ADJ) (/ˈnɒnʃ(ə)l(ə)nt/)

(of a person or manner) feeling or appearing casually calm and relaxed; not displaying anxiety, interest, or enthusiasm.

EXAMPLE- "she gave a nonchalant shrug"

Similar: unconcerned, indifferent, detached, apathetic, casual, insouciant,,,,,, उदासीन, बेपरवाह, विरक्त, मस्तमौला

6) Canny (ADJ) (/ˈkani/)

having or showing shrewdness and good judgement, especially in money or business matters.

EXAMPLE- "canny investors will switch banks if they think they are getting a raw deal",,,, **Similar:** shrewd, astute, sharp-witted, discerning, acute,,,,,, **कपटी, चतुर, चालाक, छली, धूर्त**

7) Clairvoyant (NOUN) (/kleɪˈvɔɪənt/) दिव्यदृष्टा

person who claims to have a supernatural ability to perceive events in the future or beyond normal sensory contact.

EXAMPLE- "she has had a message from a clairvoyant that her son is alive and well"

Similar: fortune teller, forecaster of the future, prophet

8) Fraught (ADJ) (/frɔ:t/)

causing or affected by anxiety or stress.

EXAMPLE- "there was a fraught silence"

Similar: anxious, worried, upset, distraught, agitated

9) Impute (VERB) (/ɪm'pju:t/)

6) Serendipity (NOUN) (seh·ruhn·di·puh·tee)

the occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. / good luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries **Similar:** happy chance, happy accident good luck, good fortune, आकस्मिक लाभ, अकस्मात् से कुछ खोज करना



7) Tome (NOUN) (təʊm/)

a book, especially a large, heavy, scholarly one.

Example- "a weighty tome"

Similar: volume, book, work, writing, publication

8) Toady (NOUN) (/ 'təʊdi /)

a person who behaves obsequiously to someone important.

Similar: sycophant, fawner, flatterer, spaniel, bootlicker, yes-man, चाटुकार, चापलूस



9) Vilify (VERB) (/ˈvɪlɪfaɪ/)

Speak or write about in an abusively disparaging manner.

Similar: disparage, denigrate, defame, revile, berate, belittle

10) Trenchant (ADJ) (/ˈtrɛn(t)ʃ(ə)nt/)

vigorous or incisive in expression or style./ clearly or sharply defined to the mind

Similar: cutting, pointed, piercing, sharp, biting, stinging, mordant, pungent,, तीखा, पैना, तीव्र
