
Cutting fuel taxes is a **sure-shot way** to address a major component of **price pressures**

The latest retail inflation data suggest, at **first flush**, that price pressures have begun to **moderate** in the economy, with the August print for CPI showing inflation having slowed for a second straight month to a **5.3% pace**, after July's 5.59%. Price **trends** among the **constituents** of the Consumer Price Index and the latest Wholesale Price Index-based inflation, however, show that it would be **premature** to **drop the guard** on price gains.



For one, the year-earlier inflation reading was elevated thus imparting a favourable base effect. Month-on-month, however, the CPI nudged up 0.25% from July, belying the inference of softening inflation. And the pace of price gains in at least three essential food components speeded up from the preceding month, with meat and fish, dairy and oils and fats posting significant accelerations. Edible oils have been on a tear for months now — the August print was 33% after July's 32.5% — and an earlier round of cuts in import duties have had little impact in cooling their prices, forcing the Centre to announce another tranche of duty reductions this month.


