✗ A noun is any word that names a person, a place or a thing. Thus, Noun = name of person, place or a thing.

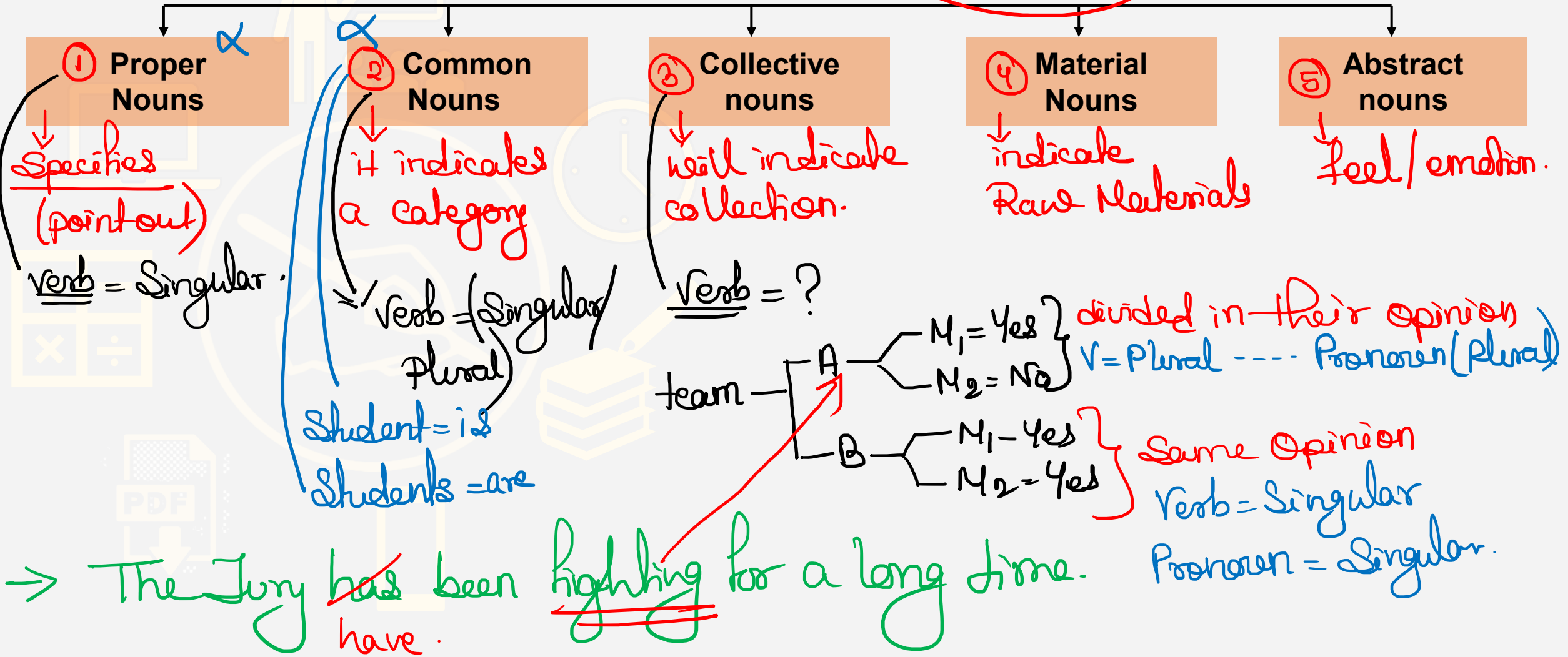

Rule 1: He gave/ me many / ~~informations~~ pieces of information. go through

- ❖ These are uncountable nouns.
- ❖ We can not pluralise such nouns by adding `s' or 'es'.
- ❖ We should not use article A/An with such nouns. These are -

✓ Scenery, poetry, furniture, advice, information, hair, language, business, mischief, bread, stationery, crockery, luggage, baggage, postage, knowledge, wastage, money, jewellery, breakage, word (while indicating any promise/message) etc.

Note

Whenever the names of subjects like mathematics, politics etc are linked to any other noun or pronoun — indicating some different meaning. → We must use a plural verb after them.

Rule 2:

✓ **Some nouns look plural in form but have singular meaning. Such nouns take singular verb. These are:**
news, innings, politics, summons, physics, economics, ethics, mechanics, mathematics, measles, mumps, rickets, billiards, draughts, etc.

RULE 3:

Some nouns always remain in plural form and take plural verb. Assets, alms, amends, annals, archives, ashes, arrears, auspices, species, scissors, trousers, pants, clippers, bellows, fangs, eyeglasses, goggles, belongings, breeches, Bowels, braces, binoculars, dregs, earnings, entrails, embers, fetters, fireworks, longings, lees, odds, outskirts, particulars

cattle, clergy, cavalry, infantry, poultry, peasantry, children, gentry, police, cannon, tenantry etc.
