Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 1: Each, Every and No

If the word "each," "every" or "no" comes before the subject, the verb is singular.

Example: No smoking or drinking is allowed.

Every man and woman is required to check in.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 2: If one subject is singular and the other is plural and the words are connected by the words "or," "nor," "neither/nor," "either/or," or "not only/but also," use the verb form of the subject that is nearest the verb.

Example: Either the bears or the lion has escaped from the zoo.

Neither the lion nor the bears have escaped from the zoo.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 3: Each, Every and No

If the word "each," "every" or "no" comes before the subject, the verb is singular.

Example: No smoking or drinking is allowed.

Every man and woman is required to check in.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 4: Indefinite pronouns are considered singular and require singular verb forms.

The following is the list of indefinite pronouns:
anyone, anybody, anything, No one, nobody,
nothing, someone, somebody, something,
everyone, everybody, everything, whatever and
whoever.

Example: Everyone wants to watch the movie.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 5: Indefinite pronouns typically take singular verbs. The exceptions to the rule include the pronouns "few," "many," "several," and "both." These always take the plural form.

Example: Few were left alive after the flood.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 6: After many/a great many/a good many, etc., the noun is always plural, which is followed by a plural verb.

Example: A great many girls are following fashion trends these days.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 7: After 'a number of/a large number', the noun and verb in the sentence are always plural.

Example: A number of soldiers have lost their lives on the border.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 8: After 'the number', the noun is plural but the verb is singular.

Example: The number of soldiers at the border is large.



Subject-Verb Agreement: Advanced Tricks

Trick 9: Sometimes the subject is separated from the verb by such words as along with, as well as, besides, not, etc. In this case always use the verb according to first subject.

Example: The politician, along with the newsmen, is expected shortly.

Excitement, as well as nervousness, is the cause of her shaking.
