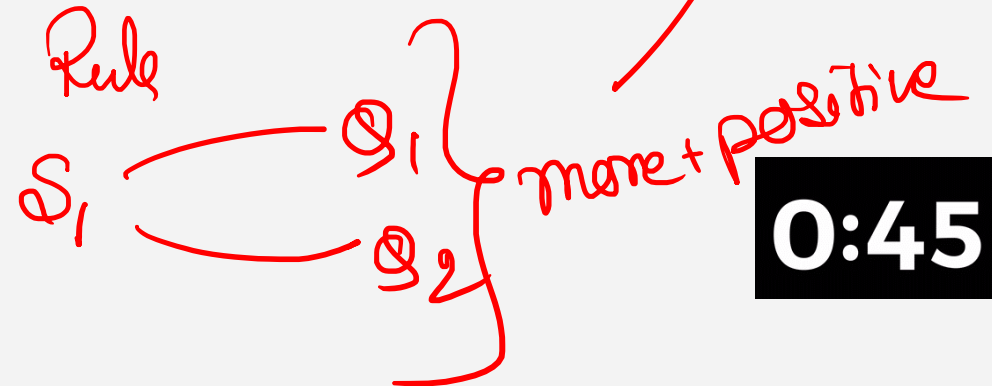



Governor of Reserve Bank of India, Raghuram Rajan provided no surprises in his final monetary policy announcement as he kept the central bank's (1) focus on inflation by leaving interest rates unchanged for the second successive time this fiscal. The rationale(7) for sitting pat on rates is the sharper-than-anticipated increase in food costs, particularly the rising prices of pulses and cereals; at the same time, services inflation has remained somewhat sticky. And of course there is a lot (8) on the steady progress of the rains so far has translated into a strong improvement in sowing, with its potential for a salutary impact on food inflation. The full impact that the implementation of the Seventh Pay Commission's recommendations will have on house rents and, as a result, the CPI, could have influenced the RBI's price stability (9). It is these risks to the inflation target that prompted Mr. Rajan to stay the course, even as the RBI continues to ensure that liquidity remains adequate. Expressing broad confidence in the RBI's ability to stay on the "glide path" to achieving 5 percent inflation by March 2017, Mr. Rajan has (10) the fact that his successor will, in all likelihood, have the advantage of being joined by five other members of the Monetary Policy Committee when they meet to decide interest rates in October. It will no longer be lonely at the top at the RBI.
