OVATION (NOUN)- a sustained and enthusiastic show of appreciation from an audience, especially by means of applause. Similar: applause, clapping, cheering










ERADICATE (VERB)- destroy completely; put an end to.

Similar: get rid of, do away with, remove, suppress, exterminate








SOLEMN (ADJ)- characterized by deep sincerity. Similar: sincere, earnest, honest, genuine, firm, committed










SUCCOUR (NOUN)- assistance and support in times of hardship and distress.

EXAMPLE- Vanquishing world child hunger and starvation might only be a chimera.








INEPT (ADJ)- having or showing no skill; clumsy.










SHABBY (ADJ)- in poor condition through long use or lack of care.
