

Mahendra's

1) Promulgate (/'prpm(ə)lgeɪt/) (VERB) put (a law or decree) into effect by official proclamation. **Example-** "in January 1852 the new Constitution was promulgated" Similar: put into effect, enact, implement, enforce आज्ञाप्ते देना

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2) Sangfroid (/sõˈfrwɑː/) (NOUN) composure or coolness shown in danger or under trying circumstances. Similar: composure, equanimity, equilibrium **Example-** I was amazed at how he retained his sangfroid throughout the discussion. आत्मसंयम, धैर्य, ध्राराज

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3) Anchorite (/ˈaŋkərʌɪt/) (NOUN) a religious recluse. Similar: hermit, recluse, ascetic **Example-** Why, my lord, I told him I came to visit an old anchorite Here for devotion. सन्यास

4) Burlesque (/bəːˈlɛsk/) (NOUN)

मजाक, कारटून, खिल्ली

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an absurd or comically exaggerated imitation of

something, especially in a literary or dramatic work;

Example- "a novel which is a burlesque of the literary life"

Similar: parody, caricature, travesty, pastiche

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5) Palpitate (/'palpiteit/) (VERB) shake; tremble. **Example-** "she was almost palpitating with excitement" Similar: quiver, quake, shiver, shudder कॉपना, धड़कना, तड़पना

6) Plain¹ (/pleɪn/) (Adv)

used for emphasis.

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Example- "perhaps the youth was just plain stupid" Similar- utterly, absolutely, completely, totally सर्वथा, स्पष्ट रूप से

7) Labile (/'leɪbʌɪl/) (Adj)

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of or characterized by emotions which are easily aroused, freely expressed, and tend to alter quickly and spontaneously. Synonyms- fluctuating, inconstant, unstable, varying **Example-** He was noted to be tearful and emotionally labile during the assessment. ... अस्थायी, अस्थिर, परिवर्ती

8) Camouflage (ka·muh·flaazh) (VERB)

conceal the existence of (something undesirable).

Example- "grievances should be discussed,

not camouflaged"

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Synonyms- disguise, hide, keep hidden, cover छद्मावरण से छिपाना

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9) convoluted (kon·vuh·loo·thud) (Adj) especially of an argument, story, or sentence) extremely complex and difficult to follow. **Example-** "the film is let down by a convoluted plot in which nothing really happens" Similar: complicated, intricate, impenetrable पेचीदा I VI

10) <u>bewail (/bɪˈweɪl/)</u> (VERB) express great regret, sadness, or disappointment about (something). **Example-** "men will bewail the loss of earlier freedoms" Similar: lament, bemoan, deplore, mourn शोक मनाना

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1) Beside yourself with joy

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Meaning: To be extremely happy. Example: I can see that you are beside yourself with

joy on being selected for the job, congratulations.



2) Fair and square

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Meaning: Being direct or fair. Example: To tell you fair and square, I did everything that I was meant to do, but I still feel unfulfilled.

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3) Having an Ace up the sleeve

- Meaning: Have an advantage that is currently being withheld for future purposes.
- Example: Brian kept quiet at the board meeting, who knew he had an Ace hidden up his sleeve the whole time.

4) Hook, line and sinker

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Meaning: Doing something or trying to achieve something with thoroughness and passion. Example: I have set my mind to go through the spreadsheets by Monday and I am working for it Hook, line and sinker.

5) Down for the count

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Meaning: Tired; giving up. Example: My pet dog is down for the count after playing the whole day with the frisbee.

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1) Inhibited (/In'hIbItId/) (Adj) unable to act in a relaxed and natural way because of self-consciousness or mental restraint Similar: shy, reticent, self-conscious, reserved, diffident, bashful, coy **Example-** "I could never sing song publically, I'm far too inhibited" सकाचे

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2) Repartee (/ rεpaː'tiː/) (NOUN) conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. **Example-** "he had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee" Similar: banter, badinage, witty conversation, bantering, raillery, witticism हाजिर जवाबी

3) Procure (/prəˈkjʊə/(verb) obtain (something), especially with care or effort. Similar: obtain, acquire, get, find, secure EXAMPLE- The doctor promised to procure it for him and began to ask how he was feeling. परिश्रम से प्राप्त करना

4) slay (/sleɪ/) (Verb)

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greatly impress or amuse (someone).

Similar: amuse greatly, entertain greatly Example- Those old movies still slay me! बहुत प्रभावित करना

5) Swathe² (/sweið/) (VERB)

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wrap in several layers of fabric.

Example- "his hands were swathed in bandages" Similar: envelop, bind, swaddle, bandage लपेटना, बाँधना

<u>6</u> Tacky² (/'taki/) (Adj)

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showing poor taste and quality.

Example- "even in her faintly tacky costumes,

she won our hearts"

Similar: tawdry, garish, gaudy, showy

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7) Skulk (/skʌlk/) (Verb)

shirk one's duties or responsibilities.

Example- "we were accused of skulking"

Synonyms- evade, dodge, avoid

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8) Salubrious (/səˈluːbrɪəs/) (Adj) favorable to health of mind or body Synonyms- recuperative, salubrious, salutiferous

Examples- It was quite salubrious inside:

bed platform fire with hood, boxes for food. स्वास्थ्यवर्धक

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<mark>9) Balmy (/ˈbɑːmi/) (Adj)</mark>

tranquil, clement

characterized by pleasantly warm weather.

Example- "the balmy days of late summer"

Similar: mild, gentle, temperate, calm,

सुहावना, शान्तिदायक, सुखदायी

10) Shrug (/ʃrʌg/) (VERB)

घसोटना

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dismiss something as unimportant.

Example- "the managing director shrugged off the criticism"

Similar: disregard, take no notice of, ignore

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- 2. 'Speak of the devil' this means that the person you're just talking about actually appears at that moment.
- "Hi Tom, speak of the devil, I was just telling Sara about your new car."
- **3. 'See eye to eye'** this means agreeing with someone. "They finally saw eye to eye on the business deal."
- **4. 'Once in a blue moon' –** an event that happens infrequently. "I only go to the cinema once in a blue moon."
- 5. 'When pigs fly' something that will never happen. "When pigs fly she'll tidy up her room."
- 6. 'To cost an arm and a leg'- something is very expensive. "Fuel these days costs and arm and a leg."

1) loom² (/luːm/) <u>(VERB</u>)

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appear as a vague form, especially

one that is large or threatening.

Example- "vehicles loomed out of the darkness"

Similar- emerge, appear, become visible धुंधला दिखाई देना, संकट मँडराना

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2) Preposterous (/prɪˈpɒst(ə)rəs/) (Adj) contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. Example- "a preposterous suggestion" Similar: absurd, ridiculous, ludicrous, farcical बेहूदा, बेतुका, बेढंगा

3) Rampant (/ˈramp(ə)nt/) (Adj) (especially of something unwelcome) flourishing or spreading unchecked. example- "political violence was rampant" Similar: uncontrolled, unrestrained, unchecked अनियंत्रित



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4) Indemnity (/ɪnˈdɛmnɪti/) (NOUN)

security or protection against a

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loss or other financial burden.

Example- "no indemnity will be given for loss of

Similar: insurance, protection, security, endorsement क्षतिपूर्ति

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5) Entrenched (/ɪnˈtrɛn(t)ʃt,) (Adj)

of an attitude, habit, or belief) firmly

established and difficult or unlikely to change;

Example- "an entrenched resistance to change"

Similar: ingrained, established, well established आरोपित हुआ

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6) Plummet (/'plʌmɪt/) (VERB)

decrease rapidly in value or amount.

EXAMPLE- "hardware sales plummeted"

Similar: plunge, t<u>umb</u>le, drop/decrease rapidly अचानक से गिरना, तेज़ी से गिरना

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7) Discrete (/dɪˈskriːt/) (ADJ) individually separate and distinct. **Example-** "speech sounds are produced as a continuous sound signal rather than discrete units" Similar: separate, distinct, individual, detached, unattached, disconnected अनिरंतर, विलग, प्रथक्

8) Inflate (/In'fleIt/) (VERB)

बढाना चढाना

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increase (something) by a large or excessive amount.

Example- "objectives should be clearly set out so as

not to duplicate work and inflate costs"

Similar: raise, put up, boost, escalate

9) Incur (/ɪnˈkəː/) (VERB)

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become subject to (something unwelcome

or unpleasant) as a result of one's own

behaviour or actions.

Example- "I will pay any expenses incurred"

Similar: <u>suffe</u>r, sustain, experience

झेलम् हुआ, व्यय किया हुआ कर्ता

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10) Unravel (/An'rav(ə)l/) (VERB) investigate and solve or explain (something complicated or puzzling). **Example-** "they were attempting to unravel the cause of death" Similar- solve, resolve, clear up

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1) To cut corners' – to do something badly or cheaply.

"They really cut corners when they built this bathroom; the shower is leaking."

2) 'To add insult to injury' – to make a situation worse. "To add insult to injury the car drove off without stopping after knocking me off my bike."

- 3) 'You can't judge a book by its cover' to not judge someone or something based solely on appearance.
- "I thought this no-brand bread would be horrible; turns out you can't judge a book by its cover."
- 4) 'Break a leg' means 'good luck' (often said to actors before they go on stage). "Break a leg Sam, I'm sure your performance will be great."
- 5) 'To hit the nail on the head' to describe exactly what is causing a situation or problem.
- "He hit the nail on the head when he said this company needs more HR support."

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1) Execrable (ek·suh·kruh·bl) (Adj) extremely bad or unpleasant. Similar: appalling, awful, dreadful, terrible, frightful, atrocious, very bad **Example-** Pitt called him "an execrable, a sole minister who had renounced the British nation." घृणित, निंदनीय

2) Ebb (/εb/) (VERB)

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(of an emotion or quality) gradually decrease.

Similar: diminish, dwindle, wane,

fade away, melt away

Example- "my enthusiasm was ebbing away" कम होना, क्षीण होना

3) Effete (/ɪˈfiːt/) (ADJ)

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weak or effeminate (typically used of a man). Similar: effeminate, unmasculine, unmanly, womanish, girlish, feminine **Example-** They saw us with our floppy fringes and effete mannerisms and went mental. दुबेल, निर्बल

4) Mendicant (mεndik(ə)nt/) (NOUN)

भिखारी, याचक, मंजता

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a beggar; a vagrant. Similar: tramp, vagabond, scrounger, sponger, Example- Rather than search for a job, Jimmy chooses to live as a mendicant who panhandles his way through each day.

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5) Wanton (/ˈwɒntən/) (ADJ) (of a cruel or violent action) deliberate and unprovoked. Similar: deliberate, wilful, malicious, malevolent, spiteful, vicious **Example-** "sheer wanton vandalism" अनियंत्रित

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6 Goad (/gəʊd/) (VERB) provoke or annoy (someone) so as to stimulate an action or reaction. Similar: provoke, spur, prick, sting, incite, rouse, stir **Example-** "he was trying to goad her into a fight" उकसाना, प्रेरित करना

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Tenebrous (/ˈtɛnɪbrəs/) (ADJ) dark; shadowy or obscure./ dark and gloomy Synonyms- ambiguous, caliginous, dim, dingy, dusky, equivocal, **Example-** Fortunately, he wasn't there, and Conrad turned in to the leafy, tenebrous cool of Miankoma Lane. अंधकारपूर्ण, अंधेरा, उदास

8) Inculcate (/ˈɪnkʌlkeɪt/) (VERB) instil (an idea, attitude, or habit)

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by persistent instruction. Similar: implant, fix, ingrain, infuse Example- "I tried to inculcate in my pupils an attitude of enquiry" मन में बिठाना, मस्तिष्क में बैठा देना

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<u>9) Heckle (/ˈhɛk(ə)l/) (VERB)</u>

interrupt (a public speaker) with derisive or

aggressive comments or abuse.

Similar: jeer, taunt, jibe at, interrupt

Example- he was heckled when he tried to

address the demonstrators"

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10) Embellish (/ɪmˈbɛlɪʃ,ɛmˈbɛlɪʃ/) (VERB) make (a statement or story) more interesting by adding extra details that are often untrue. Similar: elaborate, embroider, colour, exaggerate **Example-** "followers often embellish stories about their heroes" त करना

1) Upbraid (/np'breid/) (VERB) find fault with (someone); scold. Similar: reprimand, rebuke, reproach, scold, admonish, reprove **Example-** "he was upbraided for his slovenly appearance"

फटकारना

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2) Apposite (/'apəzɪt/) (Adj) apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. Similar: appropriate, suitable, fitting, apt, relevant, pertinent **Example-** Her remarks are extremely apposite to the present discussion. उचित, उपयुक्त, ठीक, योग्य, स्रीगत

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3) Spasmodic (/spaz'mpdik/) (Adj) occurring or done in brief, irregular bursts. Similar: intermittent, fitful, irregular, sporadic, erratic, occasional **Example-** He made spasmodic attempts to clean up the house. अनियमित,

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4) Cessation (/sε'seɪʃ(ə)n/) (NOUN) the fact or process of ending or being brought to an end. **Similar:** end, ending, termination, stopping, halting, ceasing, finish **Example-** The arrival of several police brought a quick cessation to the gang fight. विराम, समाप्ति

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5) Evanescent (eh·vuh·nes·uhnt) (Adj) soon passing out of sight, memory, or existence; quickly fading or disappearing. Similar: vanishing, fading, evaporating, disappearing **Example-** It is asked how any wisdom can be so evanescent. शीघ्र लुप्त होनेवाला, लोपनीय, क्षणजीवी

6) Intransigent (uhn·tran·suh·jnt) (Adj)

unwilling or refusing to change one's views

or to agree about something

Similar: uncompromising, inflexible, unbending,

unvielding, unshakeable

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Example- her father had tried persuasion,

but she was intransigent" हठी, आज, जिंद्री

7 Grotesque (grow·tesk) (Adj)

comically or repulsively ugly or distorted

Similar: malformed, deformed, misproportioned,

distorted

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Example- "a figure wearing a grotesque mask"

8) Strife (strʌɪf/) (NOUN)

angry or bitter disagreement over

fundamental issues;

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Similar: conflict, friction, discord, disagreement,

dissension, variance

Example- "strife within the community"

कलह, खटपट, झगड़ा

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9) Convivial (/kənˈvɪvɪəl/) (Adj)

(of a person) cheerful and friendly; jovial.

Similar: friendly, genial, affable, amiable,

congenial, agreeable, amicable

Example- she was relaxed and convivial" आनंदमय, अल्राहर्म, जुग्रा

10) Muzzy (/ˈmʌzi/) (Adj)

unable to think clearly; confused

Similar: groggy, light-headed, faint, dizzy,

shaky, muddled

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Example- "she was shivering and her head

felt muzzy from sleep"






