- A. The tags can also be fashioned into thin keypads or smart home control panels that can be used to remotely operate WiFi-connected speakers, smart lights and other IoT appliances.
- B. The metal tags named “LiveTag”, made from patterns of copper foil printed onto thin, flexible, paper-like substrates, are designed to only reflect specific signals within the WiFi frequency range.
- C. These plain objects then essentially become smart, connected devices that can signal a Wi-Fi device whenever a user interacts with them.
- D. The tags can be pasted onto plain objects that people touch and interact with every day, like water bottles, walls or doors.
- E. Researchers have developed printable metal tags that can be attached to everyday objects and turn them into ‘smart’ Internet of Things (IoT) devices by reflecting Wi-Fi signals.
- F. As a proof of concept, the team used “LiveTag” to create a paper-thin music player controller complete with a play/pause button, next track button and sliding bar for tuning volume.
