



1) Alacrity (ə' lakriti) (noun)
brisk and cheerful readiness.

Similar- readiness,
Enthusiasm, ardour, fervour
Example-"she accepted the
invitation with alacrity"

2) Amenable (adj) (ə'mi:nəb(ə))
open and responsive to suggestion;
easily persuaded or controlled.
Similar- compliant, acquiescent
Biddable, manageable, controllable
Persuadable, responsive
Example- "parents who have
amenable children"

3) Rapport (noun) (ra'pɔ:)

a close and harmonious relationship in which the people or groups concerned understand each other's feelings or ideas and communicate well.

Similar- affinity, harmony, accord

Example- she was able to establish a good rapport with the children"

4) Lionize ('laɪənlaɪz) (verb)

give a lot of public attention and approval to (someone); treat as a celebrity.

Similar- exalt, acclaim, honour,
Admire, extol, ulogize

Example- As a star athlete, she was lionized and congratulated.

(5) Lithe (adJ), (lɪθ) (especially of a person's body)

thin,
supple, and graceful.

Nimble, lissome, flexible,
fit, spry

Example- she lay gazing up
at his tall, lithe figure“

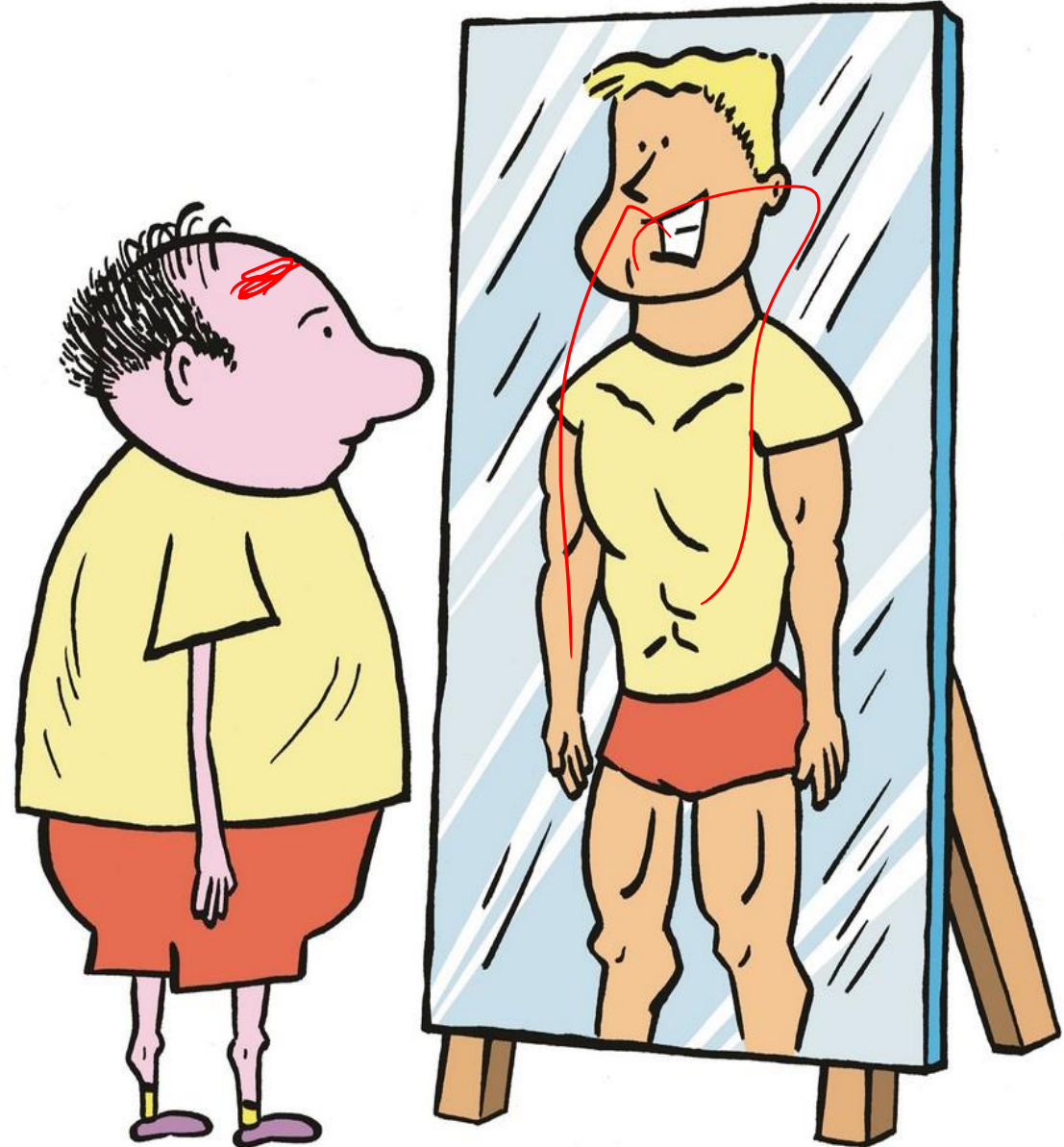
6) Delude (dɪ'l(j)uːd) (verb)

make (someone) believe something that is not true.

Similar- mislead, deceive, dupe, hoodwink

Example- I was angry with him for trying to delude me.

7) Sordid ('sɔːdɪd) (adJ)

dirty or squalid.

Similar- dirty, filthy, muddy,
grubby, shabby

Example- the overcrowded
housing

conditions were sordid and
degrading“

8) Flagrant (*adj*) (fleɪgr(ə)nt)

conspicuously and outrageously
bad or reprehensible

Similar- blatant, glaring, obvious,
overt, evident, outrageous, Scandalous

Example- A succession of worldly
pap pontiffs brought the church into flagrant
discord with the principles of
Christianity.

9) Fallow¹ ('faləʊ) (adj)

Fallow

(of farmland) ploughed and harrowed but left for a period without being sown in order to restore its fertility or to avoid surplus production.

Similar- uncultivated, unploughed, untilled, unplanted, unsown

Example- incentives for farmers to let land

lie fallow“

10) Chicanery (ʃɪˈkeɪnəri) (noun)

the use of deception or subterfuge to achieve one's purpose.

Similar- guile, artifice, treachery

Example- Let us expose that business for its financial chicanery and reveal how they waste our tax dollars.
