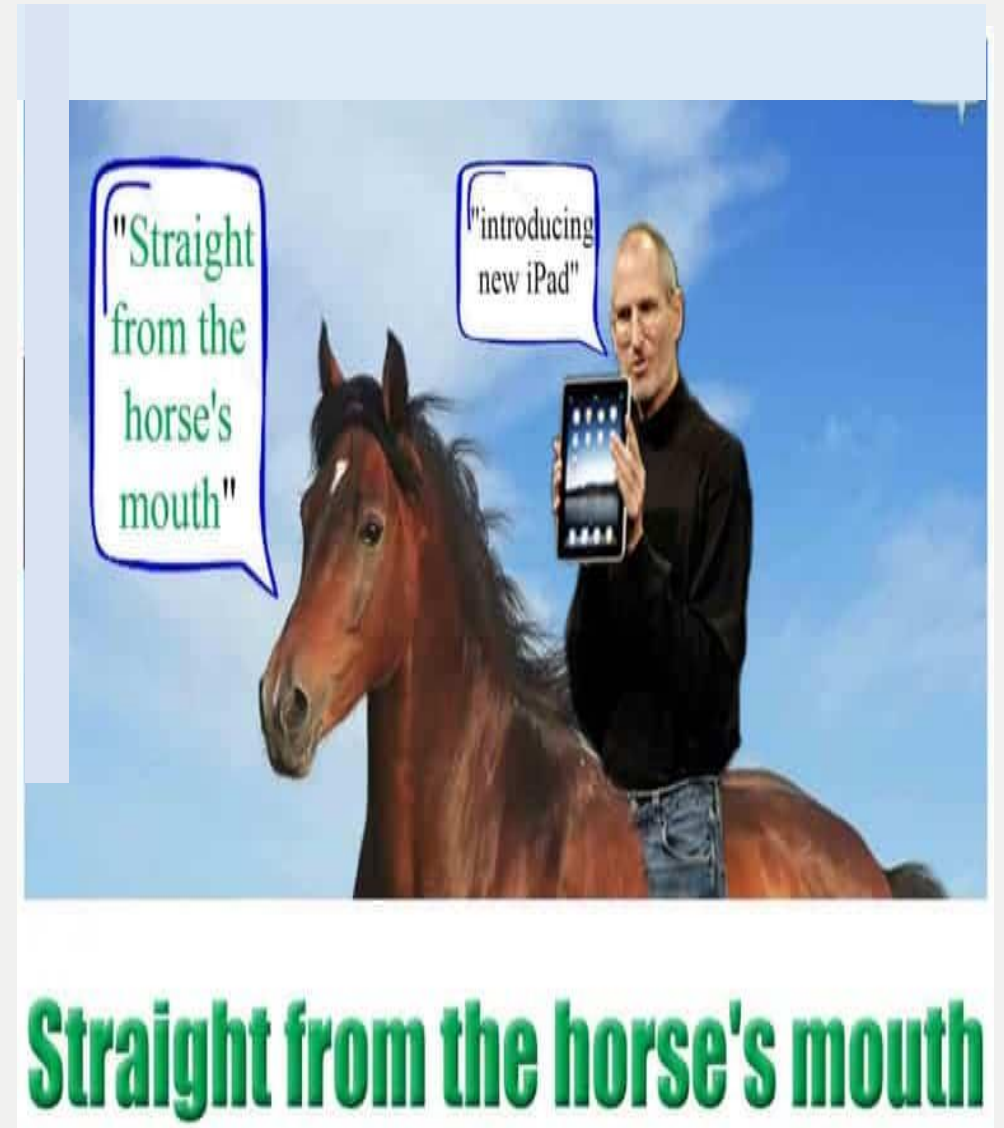
**Meaning - Don't

**Meaning - to be in the same unpleasant situation as other people**

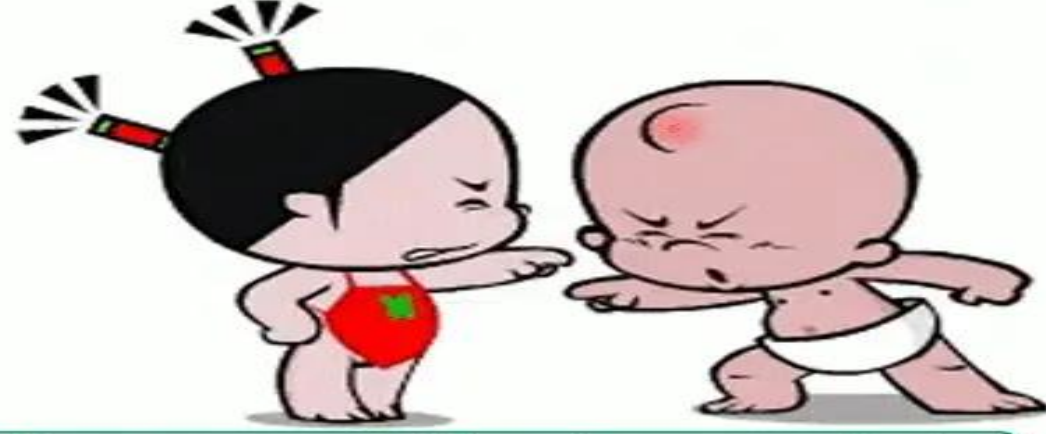

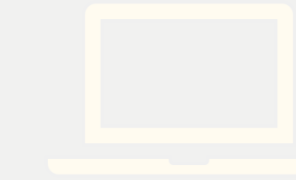

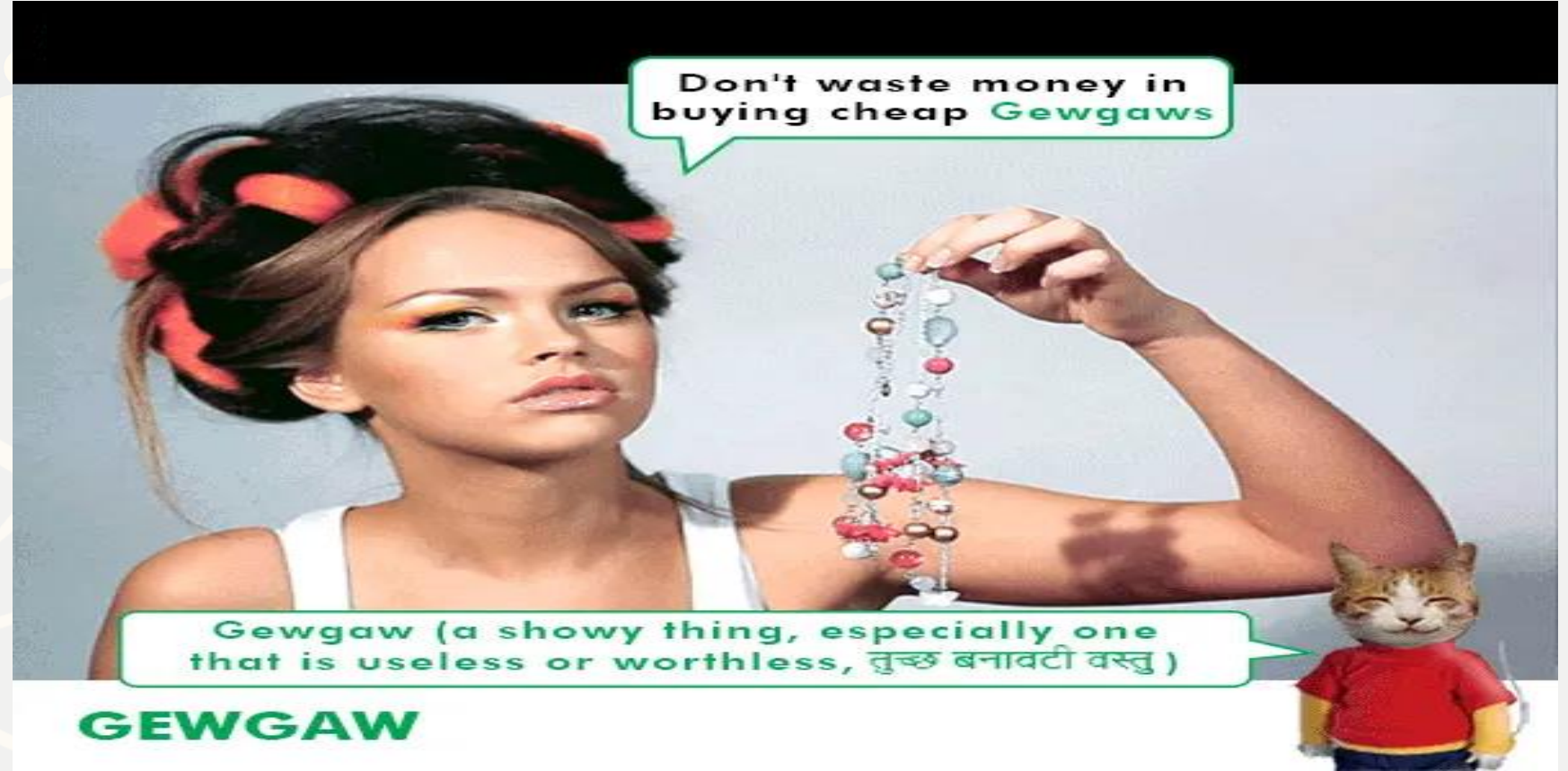
