Difference between Reflexive and Emphatic Pronoun

Reflexive Pronoun

- ❑ They are used as objects of the verb when the action of the verb returns to the doer.

I hurt myself.

The boys hid themselves.

- ❑ A reflexive pronoun, on the other hand, is vital. The sentence wouldn't make complete sense on removing the reflexive pronoun.

I hurt myself.

I hurt. (illogical sentence)

Emphatic Pronoun

- ❑ They are used to emphasise a noun or pronoun.

She herself opened the door.

The town itself is not very large.

- ❑ An emphatic pronoun can be removed from the sentence without affecting its core meaning.

She herself opened the door.

She opened the door. (no change in the meaning)

Krati enjoys the party.
 (what) object

Krati enjoys during the party.
 herself

Krati herself did these.

— will always be followed by a reflexive pronoun in absence of obj.
