- (C) Investors are only required to notify the regional office concerned of RBI within 30 days of receipt of inward remittances and file the required documents with that office within 30 days of issue of shares to foreign investors.
- (D) Reforms undertaken include decontrol of industries from stringent regulatory process, simplification of investment procedures, promotion of FDI, liberalisation of exchange control, rationalisation of taxes and public sector divestment.
