There are three Degrees-

1) Positive

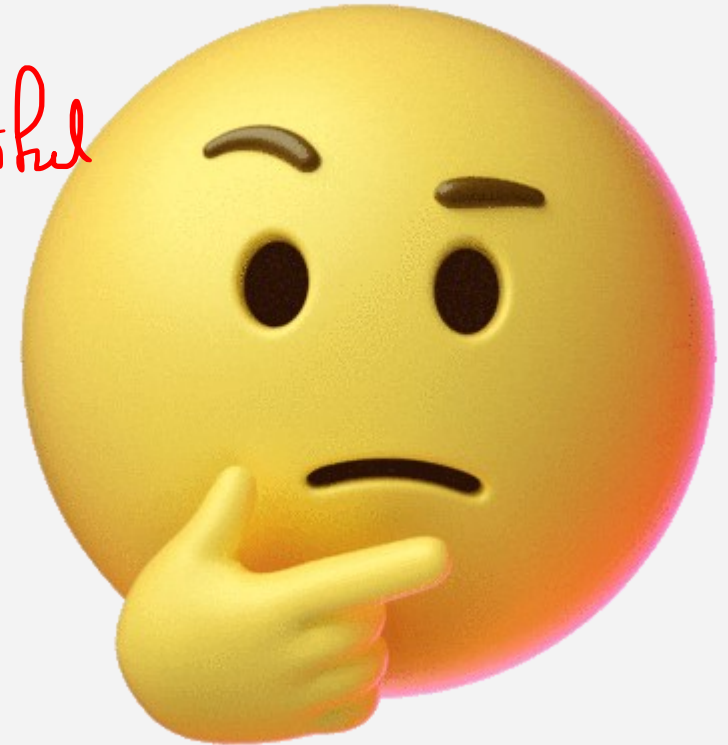
→ good / beautiful

2) Comparative

→ better / more beautiful

3) Superlative

→ best / most beautiful



✓✓ NOTE 1 ✓✓

Based on syllable

a) good = single syllabic word →

er	est.
more	most

b) beautiful = more than one syllabic word →



NOTE 2

Based on number

a) if the sentence consist^{of} only one subject = Positive Degree

b) if the sentence consist of exactly two subjects = Comparative Degree

c) if the sentence consist of more than two subjects = Superlative Degree

NOTE 3

Based on specific words

- a) (any) = Comparative.
- b) (all) = Superlative.

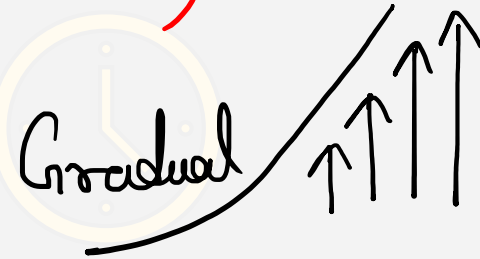

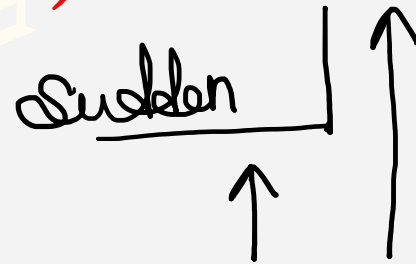
