**Answer – Option B**

**Explanation – Instead of 'were', 'was' will be used**

**2Q.** The decision to appoint an external (A)/ auditor for the bank is the mandate (B)/ of the board of governors, a body (C)/superior than the board of directors. (D)/ No Error (E)

**Answer – Option D**

**Explanation – ‘to’ will be used instead of ‘than’**

**3Q.** The majority of their (A)/income goes to rent (B)/and leaves them with hardly no (C)/money to buy nutritious food.(D)/ No Error (E)

**Answer – Option C**

**Explanation – ‘any’ will be used instead of ‘no’ as we use ‘any’ with ‘rarely’, ‘seldom’, ‘scarcely’, ‘hardly’ etc. and not ‘no’.**

**Explanation – ‘experts’ will replace ‘expert’**

**Answer – Option B Explanation – Instead of ‘in’, ‘with’ will be used because ‘with’ accompanies ‘entrust’ in the sentence when the structure is ‘entrust+somebody+with +something’ whereas ‘to’ is used in the sentence when the structure of sentence is ‘entrust+something+to +somebody’.**



**6Q.** The party is acute aware (A)/ that it need to regain (B)/ some lost popularity if it is (C)/ going to make the best of this election. (D)/ (E) No error

**Answer – Option A**

**Explanation – Use ‘acutely’ in place of ‘acute’.**

**7Q.** Once it is appointed by the President, (A)/the council of ministers (B)/are responsible (C)/to the house. (D)/No error (E)

**Explanation: Change 'are' to 'is' because the subject 'council of ministers' is considered as one unit.**

**Explanation: Delete 'the' before breakfast.**

**9Q. Most schools in Paris (A) / will stay open (B) / until the summer holidays (C) / start after Friday afternoon. (D) / No error (E)**

**Answer: Option D**

**Explanation: The fragment D of the sentence is erroneous. The preposition of time 'on' should be used before days and dates.**

**Explanation: The correct idiomatic expression is 'beat around the bush'**



**Explanation: Change 'their' into 'its'. 'Congress Party' is singular and will take the singular adjective 'its'.**

**Explanation: 'No sooner' is followed by a 'helping verb' and then the 'sub'. 'No sooner did the teacher enter' will be the correct way of writing this sentence.**

**Answer: Option (A)**

**Explanation: Refrain is followed by 'from' and not 'to'.**

**15Q. (A) Knowledge of / (B) at least two languages / (C) are required to pass / (D) the examination / (E) No error**

**Explanation: Here 'Languages' is not the main subject. Rather 'knowledge' is the main subject. Hence verb used must agree with 'knowledge'. Use 'is' in place of 'are'.**

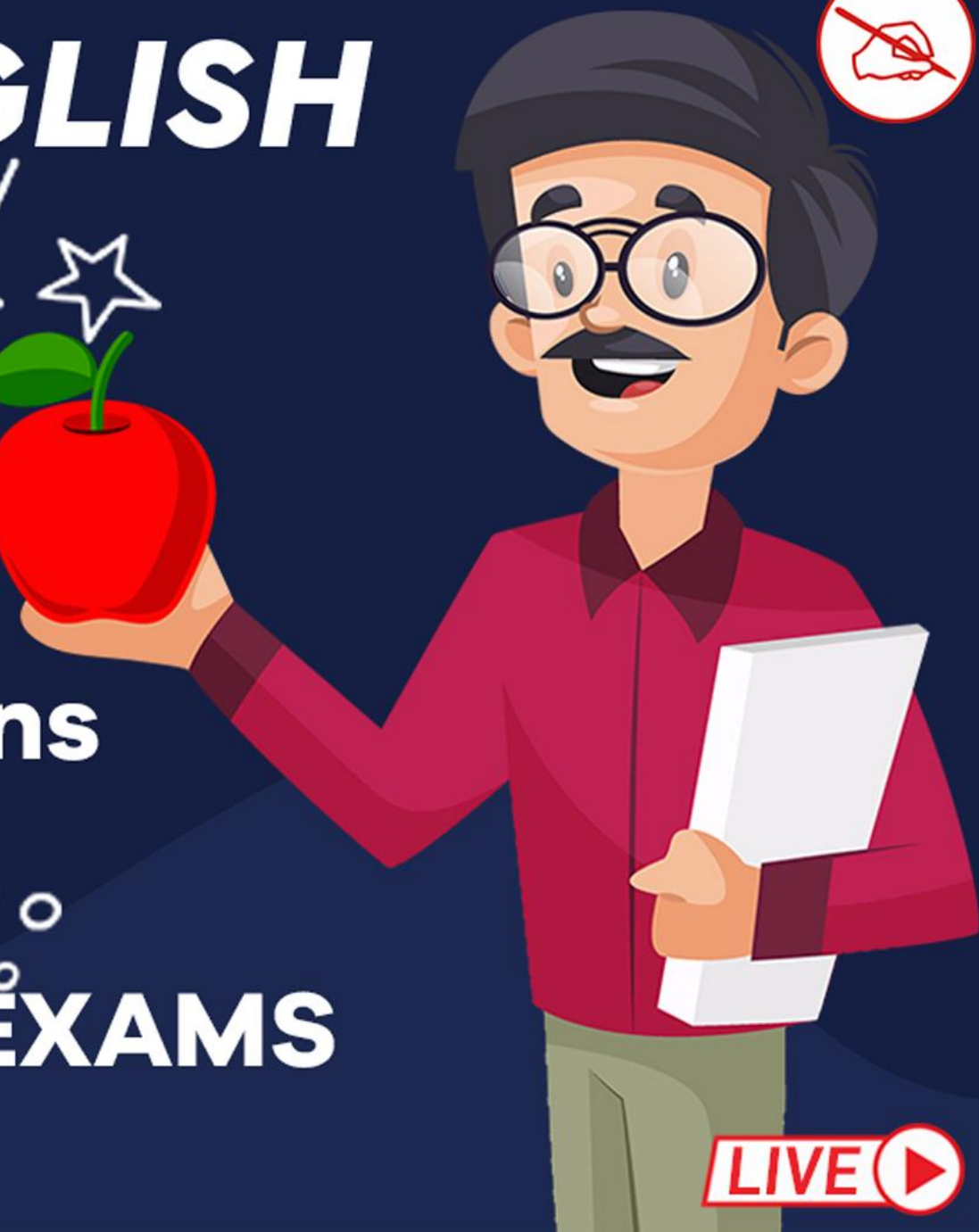
