As long as his breathing is fitful, he will continue to need an oxygen machine.



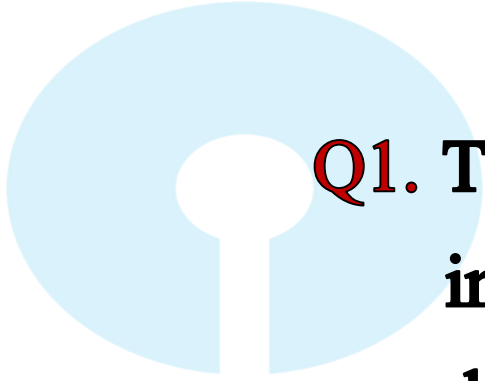

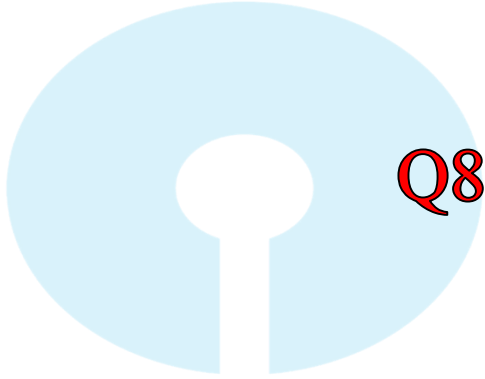
**(2) Here thing is Singular. Hence, that is not should be used.**

**(3) The Reporting Verb is in Past Tense. Hence, in Indirect statement, Past Tense should be used.**

**Therefore “a compromise was reached” will be the correct usage.**
