Indian sportspersons showed self-belief at the Olympics to return with a record tally.

87.58m capped the finest ever performance by Indian

sportspersons in the quadrennial global stage. India won seven medals — one gold, two silvers and four bronzes — and

cumulatively edged past the previous best of six at the 2012 London Games. For a country resigned to a meagre yield or none at

the Olympics since its debut in 1900, the latest edition was laden

with riches. At 23, Neeraj has the world at his feet and the skies to

aim for.

The Indian Army man has grown in stature, and to supplant German Johannes Vetter, until now the world's best javelin thrower, was no mean task. Neeraj's golden tryst was special at many levels; it was India's maiden gold in athletics at the Olympics while Norman Pritchard had won two silvers in 1900. It was also India's (A) ~~the~~ second individual gold at (B) / the Games after shooter Abhinav Bindra (C) / hit bullseye at Beijing in 2008(D).
