Synonyms: lower, put down Antonyms: upgrade Example Sentence: They aim to prevent women from being relegated to a secondary role.

#### 3. RATIFY (VERB) : (पुष्टि करना) : confirm

Synonyms: approve, sanction Antonyms: reject Example Sentence: Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.
