ENGLISH GRAMMAR CLOZE TEST

⇒ Vocab of the day :-

1. **INCUMBENT (ADJECTIVE)** : (वर्तमान) : **current**

Synonyms: existing, present

Antonyms: past

Example Sentence: The incumbent President got defeat.

2. **RELEGATE (VERB)** : (कम करना) : **downgrade**

Synonyms: lower, put down

Antonyms: upgrade

Example Sentence: They aim to prevent women from being relegated to a secondary role.

3. **RATIFY (VERB)** : (पुष्टि करना) : **confirm**

Synonyms: approve, sanction

Antonyms: reject

Example Sentence: Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.
