## Vocab of the day

### ⇒ Vocab of the day :-

1. **BOTTLENECK (NOUN)** : (बाधा) : jam

**Synonyms**: barrier, hindrance

**Antonyms**: aid, assistance

**Example Sentence**: Animated films still face bottlenecks.

2. **RHETORIC (NOUN)** : (भाषण कला) : oratory

**Synonyms**: eloquence, power of speech

**Antonyms**: quiet, conciseness

**Example Sentence**: He is using a common figure of rhetoric, hyperbole.

3. **CAPRICIOUS (ADJECTIVE)** : (मनमौजी) : inconstant

**Synonyms**: fickle, unstable

**Antonyms**: stable, consistent

**Example Sentence**: I am careful in speech words with people that have shown capricious behaviour.

**Sol.** Error in (b) part, use 'when' instead of 'than'.

**Sol.** Error in (b) part, use 'should' instead of 'will'.

Quest (9) :- The Singer and (a)/ dancer have returned (b)/ from this village yesterday. (c)/ No error (d)

**Sol.** Error in (b) part, use 'has' instead of 'have'.

**Sol.** Error in (b) part, use 'than' instead of 'when'.

Sol. Error in (b) part, use 'is' instead of 'are'.

Sol. Error in (a) part, use 'had my father given' instead of 'my father had given'.
