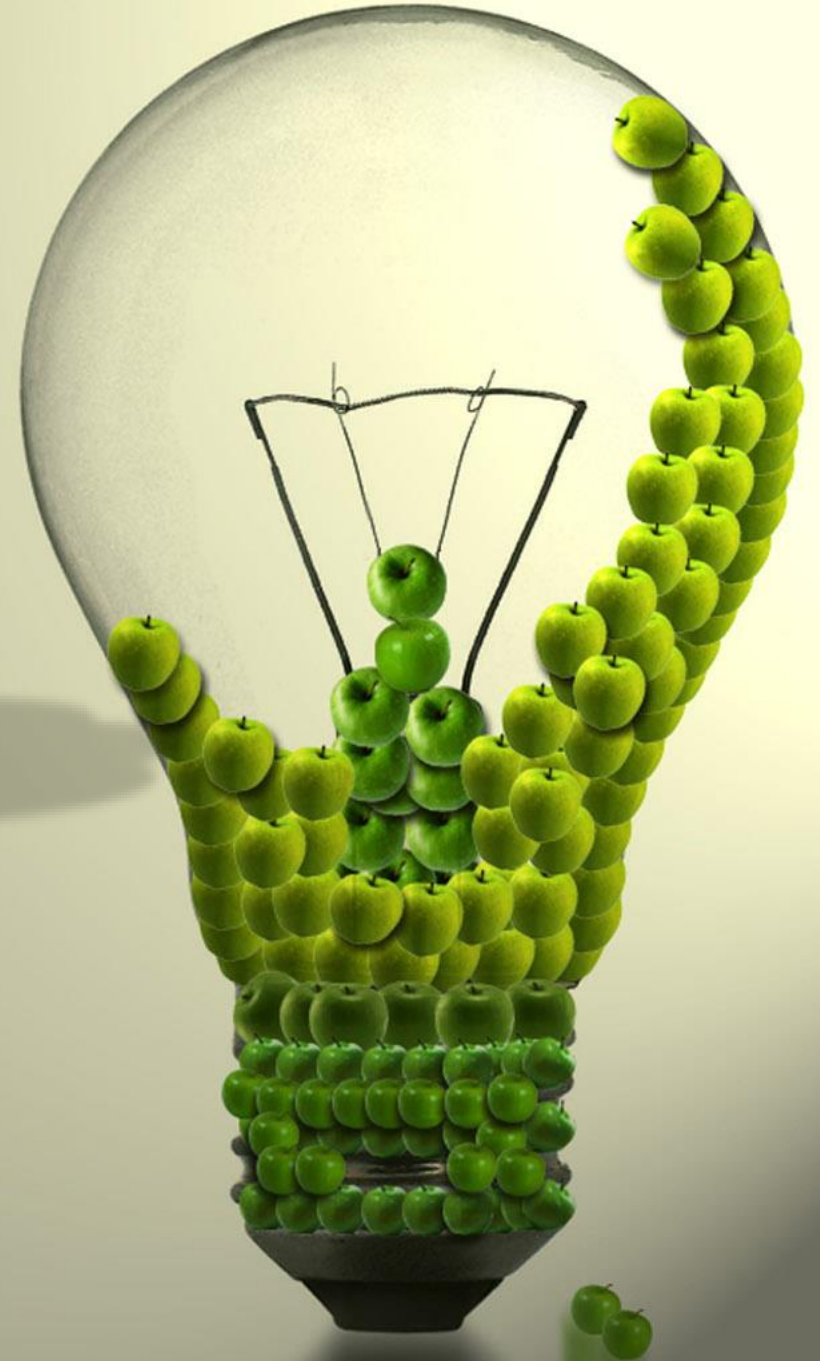

Coordinating Conjunctions

Link equal parts of a sentence including clauses or phrases.

- For Reason of an event/
action
- And adds one clause to other
- Not adds one more negative
idea
- But Shows a contrast



Subordinate

helps to connect a dependant clause

that / because / You can sit / wherever / you like.
till / until / She couldn't come because she
was ill
unless / although
though



Correlative Conjunctions

Pairs Conjunctions

- neither nor
- either ~~and~~

Either he or she
was going to
the market.
