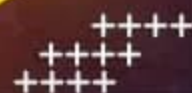

CONJUNCTION



Connect + Junction = Conjunction

Conjunction is a word which joins two words, two sentences and two clauses together .

CONJUNCTION works like a **CONNECTOR** .

KINDS OF CONJUNCTION

- 1) Co-ordinating Conjunction
- 2) Sub-ordinating Conjunction

CO-ORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS

Conjunctions which are used to join together clauses of equal rank are known as Co-ordinate Conjunctions.

And, but, for, nor, or, so, and yet .

FANBOYS

SUBORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS:

Conjunctions which are used to join clauses of unequal rank are known as Subordinating Conjunctions or a Principal Clause with a Sub-ordinate Clause or an Independent Clause with a Dependent Clause .

COMPOUND CONJUNCTIONS

Group of words which are used as conjunctions are known as Compound Conjunctions.

These are used in pairs.
