# VOCAB BASED ON IMAGES



## Vociferous



**Definition** expressing your opinions or feelings in a loud and confident way

**Usage** The council's decision was met by vociferous complaints from the assembled residents

## Germane



**Definition** connected with something in an important or appropriate way

**Usage** The suppression of documents which were germane to the case



## Denounce



**Definition** to strongly criticize someone or something that you think is wrong, illegal, etc.

**Usage** The atrocities of the army were denounced by the newspaper.

## Avidity



**Definition** very enthusiastic about something | wanting to get something very much

**Usage** The boss likes his avidity for the project.

## Fervor



**Definition** very strong feelings about something

**Usage** When asked to say a few words about his mentor the man spoke with great fervor and respect

telling the audience what a great influence he had had on his life.

## Decry



**Definition** to strongly criticize someone or something, especially publicly

**Usage** The activists decry the minister's thoughtless remarks



## Torment



**Definition** extreme suffering, especially mental suffering


**Usage** His guilt began to torment him

# GRAMMAR TRICKS



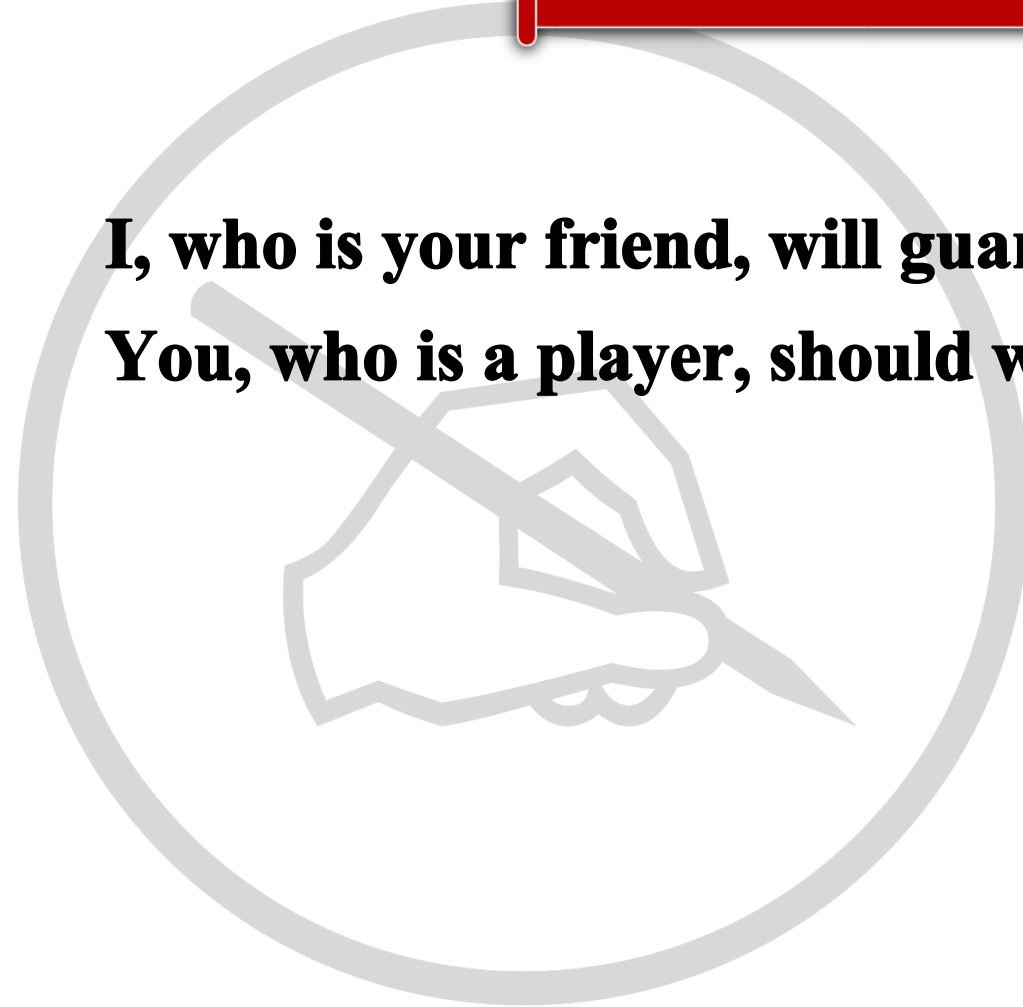
## TRICK 1

**When the Subject of the Verb is a Relative Pronoun care should be taken to see that the Verb agrees in Number and Person with the Antecedent of the relative.**



## TRICK 1


**I, who is your friend, will guard your interests.  
You, who is a player, should work hard.**





## TRICK 2

**When there is comparison of subject with any pronoun we use the subjective case of that pronoun**



- a) I'm not so old as HIM**
- b) He has more time than ME.**
- c) Sohan walks slowly than HER.**



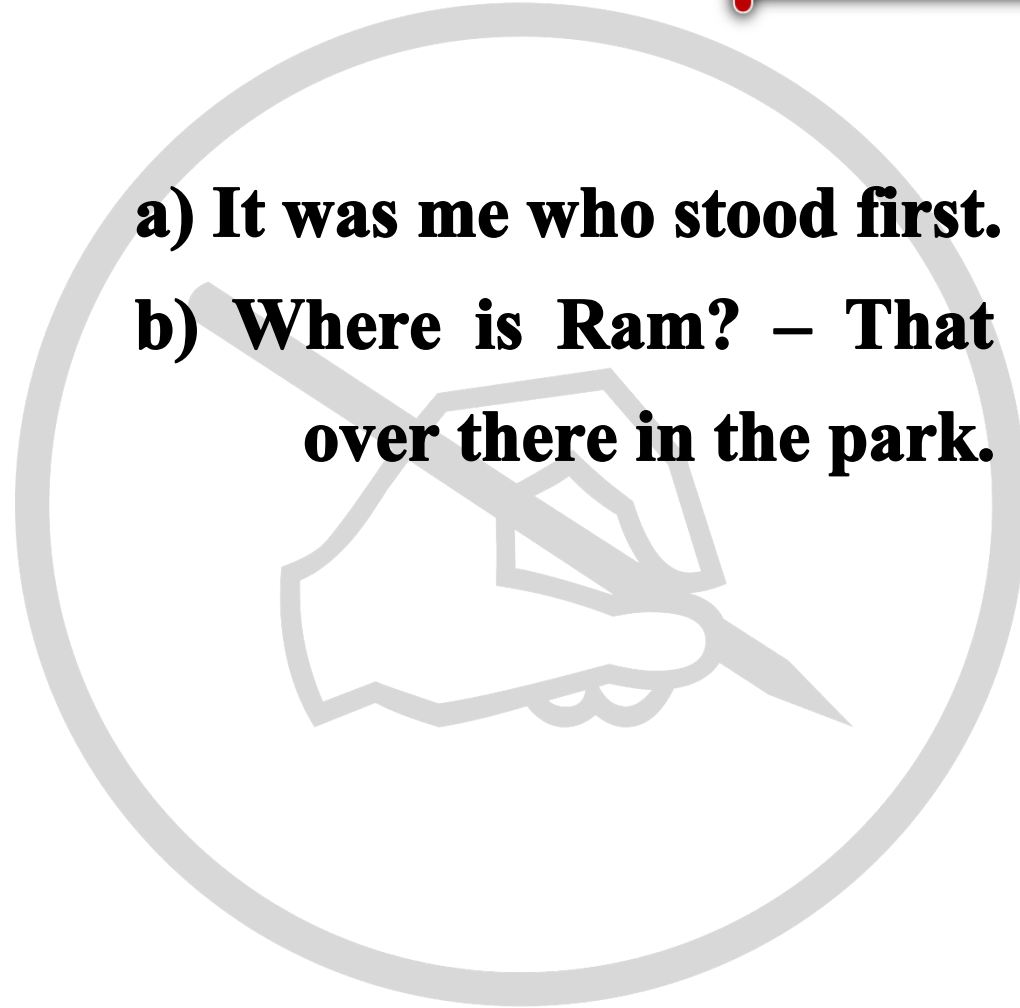
## TRICK 3

**After the verb Be(is, am, are ,was, were) we use subjective case of pronoun.**



**a) It was me who stood first.**

**b) Where is Ram? – That is him  
over there in the park.**



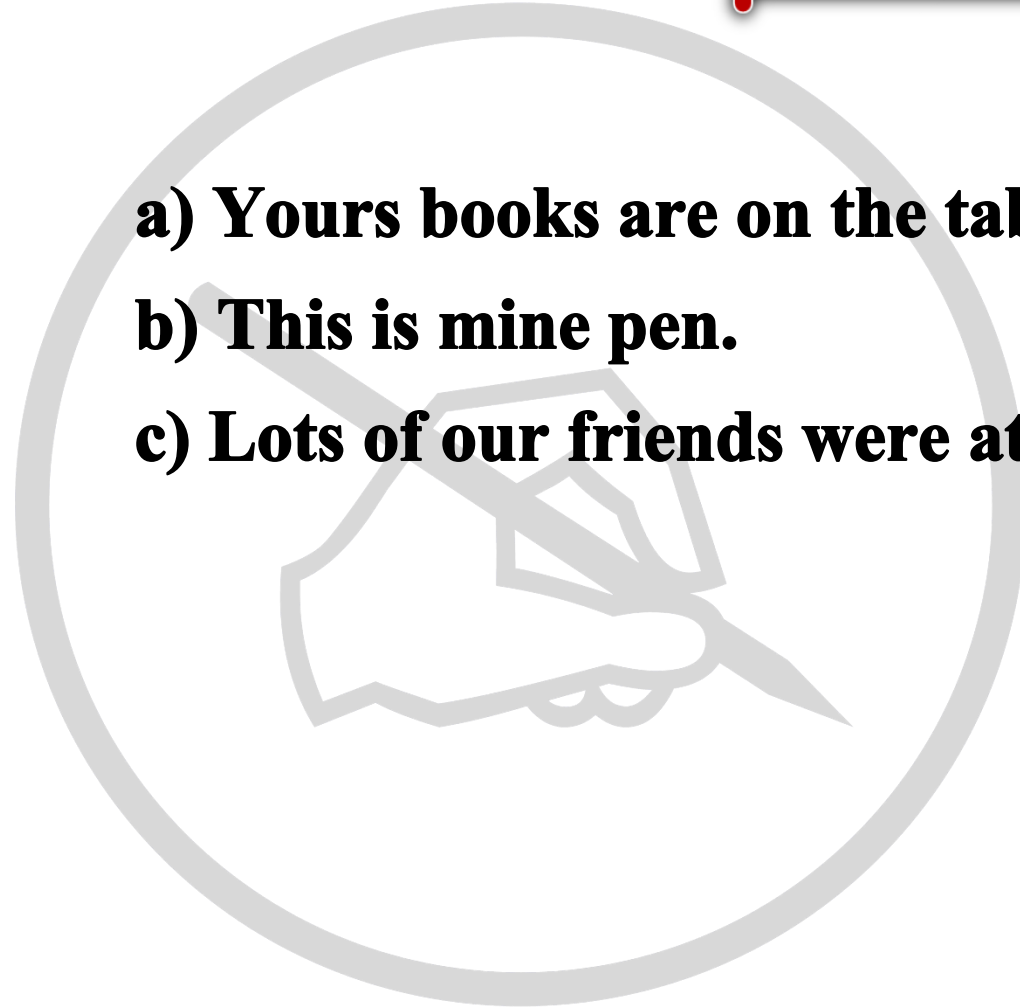


## TRICK 4

**We don't use possessive pronouns before nouns, we use possessive adjective instead.**



- a) Yours books are on the table.**
- b) This is mine pen.**
- c) Lots of our friends were at the party.**



**After “as” and “than”-**

**Use subjective case if there is a comparison between subjects.**

**Use objective case if there is a comparison between objects.**

**a) He is as slow as me.**

**b) You run faster than him.**





**a) He loves you as much as I.**

**b) My father loves my brother more than I.**
