

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VOCAB BASED ON IMAGES



Vociferous



<u>Definition</u> expressing your opinions or feelings in a loud and confident way

<u>Usage</u> The council's decision was met by vociferous complaints from the assembled residents

Germane



<u>Definition</u> connected with something in an important or appropriate way <u>Usage</u> The suppression of documents which were germane to the case

Denounce



<u>Definition</u> to strongly criticize someone or something that you think is wrong, illegal, etc.

<u>Usage</u> The atrocities of the army were denounced by the newspaper.

Avidity



<u>Definition</u> very enthusiastic about something | wanting to get something very much

Usage The boss likes his avidity for the project.

Fervor



Definition very strong feelings about something

<u>Usage</u> When asked to say a few words about his mentor the man spoke with great fervor and respect

telling the audience what a great influence he had had on his life.

Decry



<u>Definition</u> to strongly criticize someone or something, especially publicly <u>Usage</u> The activists decried the minister's thoughtless remarks

Torment



<u>Definition</u> extreme suffering, especially mental suffering

<u>Usage</u> His guilt began to torment him

GRAMMAR TRICKS

When the Subject of the Verb is a Relative Pronoun care should be taken to see that the Verb agrees in Number and Person with the Antecedent of the relative.

I, who is your friend, will guard your interests. You, who is a player, should work hard.



When there is comparison of subject with any pronoun we use the subjective case of that pronoun

- a) I'm not so old as HIM
- b) He has more time than ME.
- c) Sohan walks slowly than HER.



After the verb Be(is, am, are ,was, were) we use subjective case of pronoun.

- a) It was me who stood first.
- b) Where is Ram? That is him over there in the park.



We don't use possessive pronouns before nouns, we use possessive adjective instead.

- a) Yours books are on the table.
- b) This is mine pen.
- c) Lots of our friends were at the party.



After "as" and "than"-

Use subjective case if there is a comparison between subjects.

Use objective case if there is a comparison between objects.

- a) He is as slow as me.
- b) You run faster than him.



- a) He loves you as much as I.
- b) My father loves my brother more than I.
