The fastest growing large economy in the world

India has come a long way, but much remains to be done



ARTICLE

India represents one sixth of the world and is today the third largest economy in terms of purchasing power parity. Even in terms of nominal exchange rate of the dollar, India is the sixth largest economy. It has grown at an average rate of 7% per annum for the past 40 years, growing from a size of \$189 billion in 1980 to nearly \$3 trillion today. This growth rate is about 2% lower than that of China over the same period but represents a higher rate of return when compared with the investment rate of the GDP. Until the year of the COVID19 pandemic, India did not have a single year since 1980 when its economy contracted. It was continuously expanding, with peak rates of 9% to 10% in between.

As we celebrate our 76th Independence Day, it is worth reminding that at birth, the newborn nation was highly impoverished, thanks to centuries of colonial exploitation. It was critically dependent on foreign aid for food and forex and had an average life expectancy of only 32 years. The level of illiteracy was very high. The sheer scale of economic transformation of this nation from bottom to top league is nothing short of spectacular. Today's India is not only self-sufficient but also an exporter of food. It holds the fifth largest stock of foreign exchange and is a net lender to the International Monetary Fund, a far cry from having to go with a begging bowl to the IMF on the brink of forex bankruptcy in 1991.
