'Air India's future under Tata's is positive , but challenges persist'

New CEO's Singapore experience will help the airline

Air India's future under Tata's is positive, but will require a lot of work, which makes for an interesting **challenge** for the new CEO of the airline, Campbell Wilson, said IATA Director General Willie Walsh. "Everything **points to** Air India **regaining** their previous status as a global airline with a very strong brand that is **profitable**, well run, [and] provides good services," Mr. Walsh said on the sidelines of the International Air Transport Association's (IATA) AGM in Doha. "It is going to be an interesting challenge for the new CEO who has experience in Singapore," Mr. Walsh added. "I don't think privatizing Air India **sorts** all of the problems. I think there is a lot of work that needs to be done," said Mr. Walsh.

“There will be need to change the culture for a business that has **almost** been dependent on receiving financial support from the Indian government,” he added. He **expressed confidence** in Tata Sons’ ability to **turnaround** the airline given the fact that they were a “well-run organisation with deep pockets who can support a lossmaking Air India for a period of time”. Mr. Wilson, who visited Air India’s office on Monday, is set to join once all **formalities** are completed. His last job was as the CEO of Scoot, a low cost **subsidiary** of Singapore Airlines, prior to which he held several positions in the parent airline.

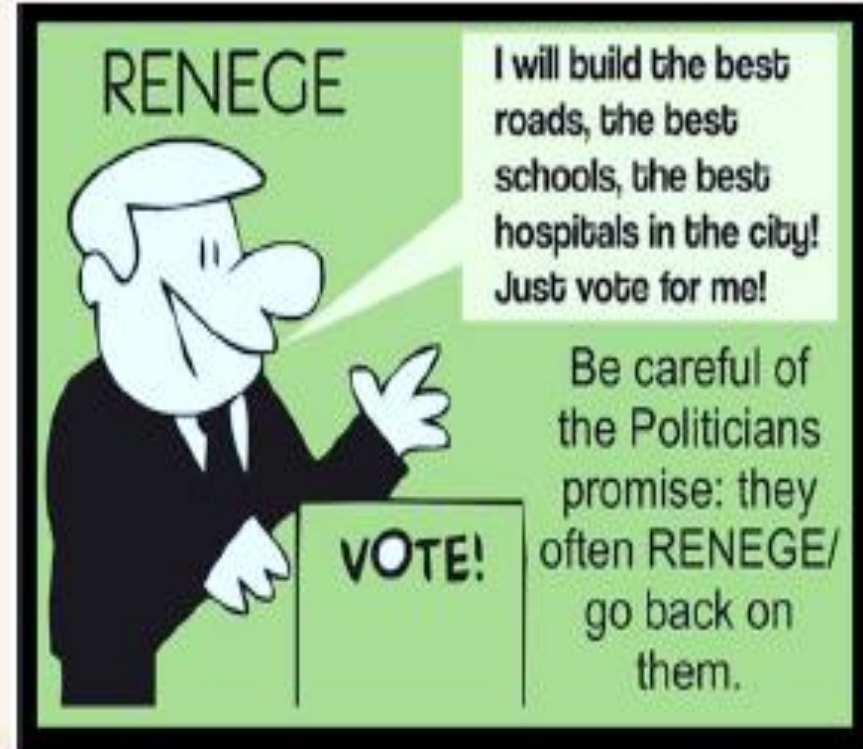

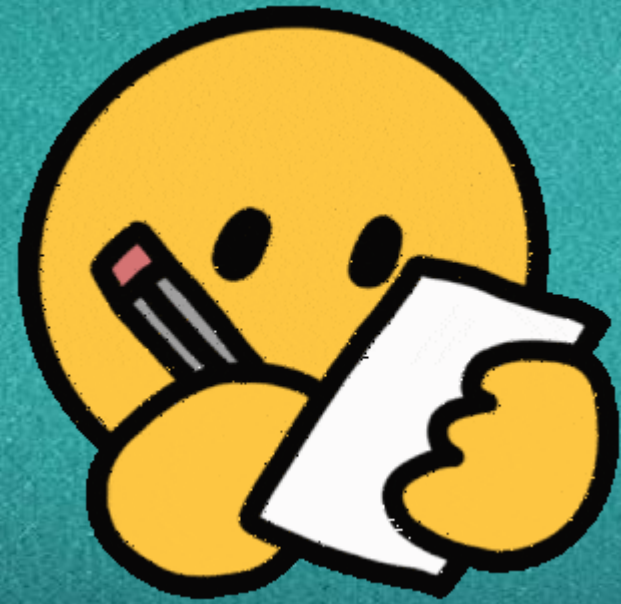
