
What is NOUN ?

NOUN

Proper nouns help distinguish a specific person, place, or thing. These words should be capitalized. The names and titles of things are always proper nouns, such as the brand name Starbucks and the personal name Jerry.

PROPER NOUN



<u>Common nouns</u> are words that refer to undefined or generic people, places, or things. For example, the country is a common noun that refers to a generic place while the word Canada is not a common noun because it refers to a specific place. E.g. house, cat, girl, foot, country

COMMON NOUN



Abstract nouns are **intangible** ideas that can't be perceived with the five senses, such as social concepts, political theories, and character traits. For example, the abstract noun anger refers to an emotion and the abstract noun courage refers to a quality a person has. E.g. love, creativity, democracy

ABSTRACT

NOUN



functions as a singular noun while referring to a group of people or things. A collective noun refers to a group that functions as one unit or performs the same action at the same time. For example: crowd, flocks, committee

COLLECTIVE

The team plays in the main gym.


A collective noun is a noun that

<u>Material nouns</u> are not countable means we cannot count them because they are in the forms of liquid, semi-liquid or solid. It is called as material noun because nouns in this class are almost materials like cloth, air, metal, gold, salt etc.

Adding 's' to the nouns not always makes its plural form

RULE 1

Some nouns like Mathematics, physics, dynamics, ethics, linguistics, metaphysics, optics, economics, News, politics, Mumps, Measles, Rickets,

Athletics, Mechanics etc. are in plural

forms but used as a singular noun.

<u>gentry, poultry,</u> <u>cattle, people,</u> <u>infantry, cavalry,</u>

children

- 1. The children are playing in the field.
- 2. On large farms, cattle are usually marked with brands.



Some nouns looks singular but always used as a plural. And it is unwise to put "s" after them to make a plural. deer, sheep,

 - crew, team,
- jury, aircraft,counsel

1. This cricket team is best for T-20 matches.



RULE 3

Nouns like Million, Hundred, thousand, pair, dozen, score, gross and **couple etc.** that are plural in meaning take the same form in singular and plural only when they are used after definite numerals.

He bought two pairs of sleepers.
 Ravi has four dozens bananas.






