



Delectable



<u>Definition</u> extremely pleasant to taste, smell, or look at | very attractive <u>Usage</u> " delectable Miss Marple "








Definition that happens again and again





Maladroit




<u>Definition</u> done without skill, especially in a way that annoys or offends people

Reprehensible




<u>Definition</u> morally wrong and deserving criticism <u>Usage</u> His conduct was thoroughly reprehensible.












<u>Definition</u> too important and respected to be changed, criticized, etc. <u>Usage</u> The priest entered the sacrosanct chamber in the temple.

Enervating



<u>Definition</u> tending to deprive of strength or vitality

<u>Usage</u> She found the constant stress to be enervating.





Discourse



<u>Definition</u> the use of words to exchange thoughts and ideas | a long talk or piece of writing about a subject

Usage " a critical discourse on important issues"
