

2. Imperative sentences:

- Mohan said to his brother, "Do not go out in the dark."
- Mohan prohibited his brother from going out in the dark.
- 3. Sentences beginning with 'Let':
- > Use of Let: It is generally used in the following ways:
- a. 'Let' is used to put forward proposals and suggestions.
- b. 'Let' is used to grant permissions.

- A. If 'let' is used to make suggestions the following rules are applied:
- 1. 'Say / said' is changed into propose, proposed or suggest, suggested.
- 2. If reporting verb contains object, it should be added after the words 'proposed to' and 'suggested to'.
- Suggested to him.
- > Proposed to them.
- 3. Inverted commas are removed and 'that' is added.
- 4. 'Should' is added along with V1 after the subject of the reported speech.

- > He said to his students, "Let's have a party." (Direct)
- He suggested to/advised his students that they should have a party. (Indirect)
- > Raman said to the cops, "Let's search the house." (Direct)
- Raman suggested to/advised the cops that they should search the house. (Indirect)
- He said to me, "do not go outside". (Direct)
- > He prohibited/restricted/stopped me from going outside. (Indirect)5

- B. If 'let' is used in the sense of 'granting permission' the following rules are applied:
- a. Say to / said to / request / requested etc. are changed according to need:
- b. The reported speech is started using 'to allow'.
- c. 'To' is used before the main verb.
- > Aman said to his father, "Let me go to picnic."
- > Aman requested his father to allow him to go to picnic.
- The boss said to the peon, "Let the man take the file."
- > The boss ordered the peon to allow the man to take the file.

- B. If 'let' is used in the sense of 'granting permission' the following rules are applied:
- d. If you want to retain the word 'let' in the indirect speech, you should keep in the form 'to let'.
- Madhu said to her assistant, "Let the servants take a leave for a day."
- Madhu ordered her assistant to let the servants take a leave for a day.
- Madhu told her assistant that the servants might be allowed to take a leave for a day.S

4. Optative sentences:

- A. John said, "May you do well in life."
- B. They said, "Long live Anna Hazare."
- C. The crowd said, "God save the Queen."

Rules for changing into indirect speech:

- a. 'Said' is changed into prayed, wished, cursed etc.
- b. As the need arises 'might' is added, and V1 is used.
- c. Remove the exclamation mark.

Let's consider the following examples pertaining to optative sentences given above:

- 1. John prayed / wished that we might do well in life.
- 2. They wished that Anna Hazare might live long.
- 3. The crowd wished / prayed that God might save the queen.
- 5. Exclamatory sentences:
- a. Such sentences express exclamation. They contain specific words.
- Hurrah, Alas, Oh, Wow etc.
- b. The basic structure of the sentence remains assertive i.e. (Sub + Verb).

Consider the following sentences:

- i. Mohan said, "what a beautiful car !"
- ii. Mohan exclaimed that it was a very beautiful car.
- iii. The businessman said to me, "Bravo! my friend did well to save the day."
- iv. The business man applauded me saying that his friend had done well to save the day.

- 5. Special case: Conversion of 'must' into indirect speech:
- a. If 'must' is used to express obligation in terms of moral duty or universal applicability, it should be used unchanged in the indirect tense:
- Mohan said, "We must obey our parents."
- > Mohan said that we must obey our parents.
- > Mohan said that one must obey one's parents.

b. In the sense of compulsion, 'must' changes 'had to'.

- > Arjun said, "I must go to Shimla next month."
- > Arjun said that he had to go to Shimla the following month.
