

The Chief Justice of India's high-octane laments about vacancies caused due to the stand-off between the judiciary and government in appointing judges has brought a renewed focus to delays in the judicial system.

. By all accounts, the judicial system is painfully slow — as of December 31, 2015, 51.2 per cent of all cases pending in the subordinate courts have been pending for more than two years and 7.5

in the subordinate courts have been pending for more than two years and 7.5 per cent for more than <u>10 years</u>; in the high courts the corresponding figures are 68 per cent and 19.22 per cent. This is <u>unacceptable</u> for any state that promises the rule of law to its citizens.

The CJI laments about the problems the Indian judiciary is facing today and it can be inferred that he is chiefly concerned about the vacancies in the judiciary system that are creating unnecessary delays.
