- Part IV-A and Part XIV-A were added by 42nd Constitutional amendment Act 1976 ✓  
*IX - Panchayat* ✓  
*Mini Constitution*
- Part IX-A (Municipalities) were added by 74th C.A. Act 1992. Part IX-B (Co-operative societies) are added by 97th C.A. act 2011 to the original constitution.
- Part VII Repealed by Con, (7th Amendment) Act, 1956 ✓

Indian Constitution originally had eight <sup>✓</sup>schedules.

Four more schedules were added by different amendments, now making a total tally of twelve.<sup>✓</sup>

- *THE SECOND SCHEDULE* contains provisions relating to the emoluments, allowances, privileges and so on of the President, Governors of States, Speaker and the Deputy Speaker of the House of the People and the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman of the Council of States and the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly and the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman of the Legislative Council of a State, the Judges of the Supreme Court and of the High Courts and the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India. (CAG)
