VOCAB OF THE DAY



Vocab of the day

⇒ Vocab of the day :-

1. **FRIVOLOUS (ADJECTIVE)** : (मूर्खतापूर्ण) : **foolish**

Synonyms: idiotic, impractical

Antonyms: intelligent, sensible

Example sentence: He is such a frivolous man.

2. **REHASH (VERB)** : (पुरानी सामग्री को नया रूप देना) : **restate**

Synonyms: reuse, change

Antonyms: deny, refuse

Example sentence: Rahul Vaidya endlessly rehashes old songs of Kumar Sanu.

3. **RESTIVE (ADJECTIVE)** : (बेचैन) : **impatient**

Synonyms: fractious, restless

Antonyms: easy-going, patient

Example sentence: Why are you getting so restive?

ENGLISH GRAMMAR PREPOSITIONS

Definition :- The words which are used to show the position of **NOUN & PRONOUN** in the sentences known as **Preposition**.

- Eg** :-
- 1) Mohan is playing **in** the ground.
 - 2) The books are **on** the table.
 - 3) They are going **into** your office.

Types of Preposition :- There are mainly 4 types of preposition :-

- Prepositions for Timings.
- Prepositions for Conditions.
- Prepositions for Directions.
- Phrasal Prepositions.



ENGLISH GRAMMAR PREPOSITIONS

⇒ Prepositions for Timings :- These prepositions are used to describe or showing the timings in the sentences.

- (1) **On** :- For showing **DAYS/DATES**
In :- For showing **MONTHS/YEARS**
At :- For showing **CLOCK HOURS**

- Eg** :- 1) She came here with me **on** Monday.
2) I will join this company **in** December.
3) You have to come **at** 7, O'CLOCK.

POINT :- There are some timings with which we can't use any preposition in the sentences

LIKE :- Tomorrow, Today, Yesterday, Last/Past + Time, Next + Time, Abroad.....



ENGLISH GRAMMAR PREPOSITIONS

Eg :- 1) I met her in yesterday. (**Incorrect**)

=> I met her yesterday. (**Correct**)

2) My friend is going to abroad for further studies. (**Incorrect**)

=> My friend is going abroad for further studies. (**Correct**)

3) She is coming here on tomorrow. (**Incorrect**)

=> She is coming here tomorrow. (**Correct**)

(2) [From – To] :- Duration of Time/Place

[Between – And] :- Middle of Time/Place

Eg :- 1) This game will be played from 10AM to 6PM.

2) You can visit us between 8AM and 5PM for this issue.

3) This manager is traveling from Mumbai to Delhi.

4) I lost my wallet between Delhi and Meerut.



ENGLISH GRAMMAR PREPOSITIONS

(3) **Before** :- Used for **Present/Past/Future**. [**Definite/Indefinite Time**]

Ago :- Used for **Past** only. [**Indefinite Time Only**]

POINT :- **Before + Time Period**
Time Period + Ago

- Eg** :-
- 1) He comes here before 10,O'Clock.
 - 2) Your manager visited this place before 3 months.
 - 3) Manya will give you this report before morning.
 - 4) Sonu got this number 5 years ago.
 - 5) They played this match 12 days ago.
