1. MALICIOUS (ADJECTIVE) : (दुर्भावनापूर्ण) : spiteful

Synonyms: malevolent, hostile

Antonyms: benevolent

Example Sentence: He took a sort of malicious pleasure in irritating the monks.

2. ABYSMAL (ADJECTIVE) : (अति-गहन) : dreadful

Synonyms: awful, terrible

Antonyms: superb

Example Sentence: The quality of the work she does is abysmal.

3. VIOLATE (VERB) : (उल्लंघन करना) : contravene

Synonyms: breach, infringe

Antonyms: comply with

Example Sentence: They had violated all the terms of a ceasefire.

- Will you?
 Won't you?
- Eg :- (1) Let him go from here, will you?
 - (2) Let them complete this project, will you?
 - (3) Let me solve this question, won't you?
- Rule (4):- Let us, Let's Shall we?
- Eg:- (1) Let's go for playing cricket, shall we?
 - (2) Let us try to solve this question, shall we?
 - (3) Let's play this match here, shall we?

Rule (5):- Affirmative Imperative sentences

Will you? Won't you?

- Eg:- (1) Open the window of this room, will you?
 - (2) Open the window of this room, won't you?
 - (3) Please give me your book, won't you?
 - (4) Please give me your book, will you?
- **Rule** (6):- The sense of Reprimand

Can't you?

- Eg:- (1) Use your own articles, <u>can't you?</u>
 - (2) Shut your mouth, can't you?
 - (3) Do your own work, can't you?
