## Vocab of the day

### ⇒ Vocab of the day :-

1. **NULLIFY (VERB)** : (अमान्य ठहराना) : **annul**

Synonyms: void, invalidate

Antonyms: ratify

Example Sentence: Judges were unwilling to nullify government decisions.

2. **VEHEMENCE (NOUN)** : (जुनून) : **passion**

Synonyms: force, ardour

Antonyms: apathy

Example Sentence: There was a lot of vehemence in his reaction.

3. **CHASM (NOUN)** : (गहरी खाई) : **gap**

Synonyms: crater, rift

Antonyms: closure, juncture

Example Sentence: The chasm between the rich and poor has grown wider over the last decade.
