GRAMMAR TRICK (2): After the verb "To Be" (is, am, are, was, were) we use subjective case of pronoun.

GRAMMAR TRICK (3): We don't use possessive pronouns before nouns, we use possessive adjective instead.







- 1) Yours books are on the table.
- 2) This is mine pen.



Answer: C 'Held upon' is the wrong phrasal verb used here, rather 'Held on' will be appropriately used as it means to wait or stop.








