

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
'Tense' originates from a Latin word 'tempus' which means Time, Tense can be understood as that form of the verb that indicates time.

TENSE

PRESENT

PAST

FUTURE









PRESENT PERFECT

Subject + have/ has + V3+ Object

1. Use present perfect to show a task recently completed.

- He has just completed his work.
- I have known him for three years.

- 2. Use present perfect if you are not clear about the time of completion of the task.
- Have you ever been to Nagpur?
- I have never known him to disobey his parents.





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

3. The present perfect should not be used with adverbs of past time. In such cases simple past should be used.

He completed his assignment last week.

- 4. Yet, always, never, already, today, often, several times, lately, recently, so far, ever etc. should be used in present perfect.
- Have you not completed the work so far?
- I have not seen her today.











PRESENT PERFECTCONTINUOUS

Subject + Has / Have + Been + V1(ing) + Since / For +Object

1. If you want to express an action that started in the past tense and is still continuing, use present perfect continuous.

They have been doing the job since last year.



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IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

2. Some verbs should be used in the present perfect form, even though they have been functioning as present perfect cont.

I have known him for a long time.





PAST TENSE

Indefinite

Subject + V2 + Object

Continuous

Subject + was/ were+ V1(ing) + **Object**

Perfect

Subject + had+ V3 + Object

Perfect Cont.

Subject + had+ Been + V1(ing) + Since / For + Object

SIMPLE PAST (PAST INDEFINITE)

Subject + + V2 + Object

1. To indicate actions committed in the past.

We went to Nagpur last month.

2. For habits in past.

I visited Nainital every year.

- 3. After the expression "It is time".
- It is time we started giving attention to saving for the future.











IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

4. We use simple past in PLURAL FORM to indicate an unreal situation by using words like: wish, if, as if, and as though.

- I wish I am a king. (wrong)
- I wish I were a king. (correct)
- If I was the captain I would choose to bat first. (wrong)
- If I were the captain I would choose to bat first. (correct)





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

- 5. After the expression 'It is time + subject', to imply it is late.

6. After would rather + subject to indicate preference.

- It is time you should start working hard. (wrong)
- It is time you started working hard. (correct)
- Shall I help him ? I would rather if you don't. (wrong)
- Shall I help him ? I would rather if you didn't. (correct)











PAST CONTINUOUS

Subject + was /were + V1(ing) + Object

1. In past a work was being done when somebody spotted.

When I visited her, she was cooking meal.

2. To indicate compulsive habits.

He was always abusing others.



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IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

3. To denote two tasks occurring together.

While I was reading, Mohan was watching television.











PAST PERFECT

Subject + had + V3 + Object

1. To describe an action that got over before a given time in the past.

- He learned how to drive a car even before he was eighteen years old. (wrong)
- He had learnt how to drive a car even before he was eighteen years old. (correct)





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

- 2. If two actions take place in the past (connected with before/after) the former must be formed using the past perfect tense.
- He completed his homework before I reached his home. (wrong)
- He had completed his homework before I reached his home. (correct)







PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS

To describe an action that began prior to a certain point in the past and continued up to that particular point.

- Amitabh had acted for more than twenty five years when S.R.K. entered Bollywood. (wrong)
- Amitabh had been acting for more than twenty five years when S.R.K. entered Bollywood. (correct)





FUTURE TENSE

Indefinite

Subject + will /shall +V1 + Object

Continuous

Subject + will /shall + V1(ing) + **Object**

Perfect

Subject + will /shall + Have + V3 + **Object**

Perfect Cont.

Subject + will /shall + Have + Been + V1(ing) + From / For + Object













IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

SIMPLE FUTURE (FUTURE INDEFINITE)

Subject + Will/Shall + V1 + Object

- 1. 'Shall' is used for 1st, 2nd & 3rd person to show and 'will' for 1st, 2nd & 3rd person to show.
- We shall have our dinner at nine.





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

2. 'Shall' and 'will' should not be used to express the following: In traditional phrases to express a wish.

God bless you.





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

3. Future Indefinite tense can also be represented in the following manner without using will / shall.

- The movie is about to start.
- The movie releases on the 5th.
- We are playing for victory this evening.
- Kr. Vishwas is to file his nomination from Amethi.
- She is to get married tomorrow.





FUTURE CONTINUOUS

Subject + will /shall + be + V1(ing) + Object

1. To express an action going on in the future.

■ When I reach there he will be shooting for the last scene.

2. To express events in the future.

☐ He will be staying here for the entire weekend.





FUTURE PERFECT

Subject + Will / Shall + Have + V3 + Object

1. When two actions are connected with 'before' and 'after'.

- The patient will die before the doctor arrives. (wrong)
- The patient will have died before the doctor arrives. (correct)







FUTURE PERFECT CONTINUOUS

Subject + Will / Shall + Have + Been + V(ing) + For/From + Time

- 1. Actions which will began in future and remain continuous in it for a long time.
- In November, I will have been working at my company for three years.
- At five o'clock, I will have been waiting for thirty minutes.





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF TENSE

2. Non action verbs like to be, to seem, or to know are not suited to the future perfect continuous tense. Instead, these verbs take the future perfect tense.

- On Thursday, I will have been knowing you for a week. (Incorrect)
- On Thursday, I will have known you for a week. (correct)
- I will have been reading forty-five books by Christmas. (Incorrect)
- I will have read forty-five books by Christmas. (correct)

- 13. This is / the first time / that I see such / an interesting movie. / No Errors

- 14. Whenever he is coming / here, he brings / many / gifts for me. / No Error
- 15. Now-a-days / he teaches English / because the teacher of English. / has gone for a month's leave. / No Error.
- 16. 'It is high time /you are starting /this business' / said Ram to Mahesh. / No Error











QUESTIONS BASED ON TENSE

- 17. A misogynist is / a person who is hating woman / but a philogynist is a person / who loves woman . / No Error 18. Before the alarm / had stopped ringing / Veena had pulled up / the shade . / No Error.
- 19. All the flowers / in his garden will /surely die before / the rains will fall . / No Error
- 20. I have been / working for this / organisation for / the last ten years . / No Error
- 21. The Teacher said / to us that we / should stay / at home if it rains . / No Error







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
