INFINITIVE

The infinitive has two forms:

- the 'to-infinitive' = to + base
- the 'bare infinitive' = base

1. The 'to-infinitive' to indicate the purpose or intention of an action:

In this case to has the same meaning as in order to or so as to.

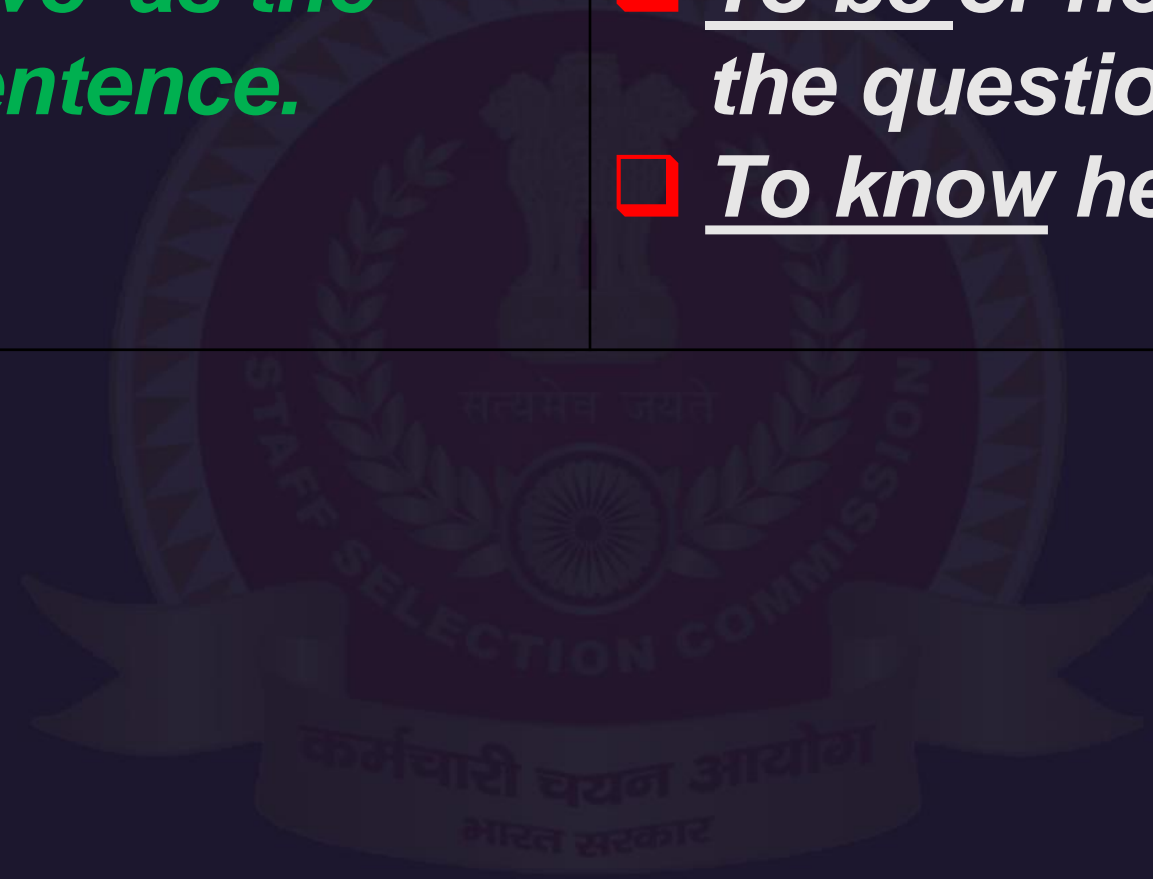
- ❑ She came to collect her pay cheque.
- ❑ The three bears went to find firewood.



IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF VERB

2. The 'to-infinitive' as the subject of the sentence.

- To be or not to be, that is the question.
- To know her is to love her.





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF VERB

RULES OF THE ZERO INFINITIVE

1. The bare infinitive after auxiliaries:

- She can't speak to you.
- He should give her some money

2. The bare infinitive after verbs of perception:
With verbs of perception, the pattern is verb + object + zero infinitive.

- He saw her fall from the cliff.
- We heard them close the door.



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IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF VERB

3. The zero infinitive after the verbs 'make' and 'let' .

- ❑ Her parents let her stay out late.
- ❑ Let's go to the cinema tonight.

4. The zero infinitive after the expression 'had better' .

- ❑ We had better take some warm clothing.
- ❑ She had better ask him not to come.



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SUBJECT – VERB AGREEMENT





1. Singular subjects take singular verbs and plural subjects take plural verbs.

- Even *an animal* has its own territory.**
- Even *animals* have *their* own territory.**



2. Subjects joined by 'AND' are usually plural and take plural verbs.

- His laptop **and** my iPad **were** stolen from the desk.
- Chennai **and** Kolkata **have** very hot weather.



3. If the subject has two singular nouns connected by AND; and both are about the same person / thing, then the verb remains singular.

- My best friend *and* roommate *is* going to US for a vacation.**
- Soup *and* bread *is* our Sunday breakfast.**



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4. When two subjects connected by AND are preceded by 'each, every or many a ', singular verb is used.

- Every** chair, table, sofa and every single piece of furniture in the house is up for auction.
- Every** man and woman in the store is requested to go through the security check.



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5. Rules for 'The number'

The expression 'the number / the variety' has a singular meaning and requires a singular verb, whereas the expression 'a number / a variety' has a plural meaning and takes a plural verb.

- The number of board members is very small.*
- A number of board members were absent.s*



6. Each, every, either, neither

The words 'each, every, either, neither', used as pronouns or else adjectives, are always singular and require singular verbs.

- Each of them does have political ambitions.**
- Each employee is responsible for clearing his desk in the evening.**
