### WORDS WITH PICTURE



#### 1. Rancour (Noun) : द्वेष

Meaning: Bitterness or resentment, especially long-lasting and deep-seated

Synonyms: Animosity, enmity, resentment, bitterness, hostility

Antonyms: Friendliness, goodwill, harmony, kindness

Sentence: Despite their past disagreements, they managed to let go of their rancour and work together for a common cause.

#### 2. Litigate (Verb) : मुक़द्मा

Meaning: To engage in a legal proceeding to resolve a dispute

**Synonyms: Sue, prosecute, bring to court** 

Antonyms: Settle, resolve, arbitrate, negotiate

Sentence: The two parties decided to litigate their dispute in court instead of attempting to settle it out of court.





#### 3. Anthropogenic (Adjective): मानवजनित

Meaning: Relating to or resulting from the influence of human beings on nature or the environment

Synonyms: Human-caused, human-made, man-made, artificial, synthetic

Antonyms: Natural, organic, non-anthropogenic

Sentence: Climate change is largely caused by anthropogenic factors such as burning fossil fuels and deforestation.



#### 4. Wanton (Adj.): अकारण

Meaning: Showing no care or concern for others; reckless

Synonyms: Reckless, malicious, cruel, irresponsible

Antonyms: Careful, responsible, conscientious, considerate

Sentence: The wanton destruction of the property angered the community.





#### 5. Dismantle (Verb): अलग करना

Meaning: To take apart or pull down; to strip furniture, equipment, or fittings; to disassemble

**Synonyms: Deconstruct, demolish, take apart** 

Antonyms: Assemble, construct, build, put together

Sentence: The workers were instructed to dismantle the old machinery before installing the new one.



#### 6. Deleterious (Adjective): हानिकारक

Meaning: Harmful or injurious to health, wellbeing, or morals; causing damage or harm

Synonyms: injurious, pernicious, detrimental

Antonyms: Beneficial, advantageous, helpful

Sentence: Smoking is a deleterious habit that can lead to various health problems, including lung cancer and heart disease.



#### 7. Envisage (Verb): कल्पना करना

Meaning: To imagine or visualize; contemplate or visualize a future event or possibility

Synonyms: Imagine, visualize, conceive, picture, see in one's mind's eye.

Antonyms: Disregard, overlook, ignore, neglect.

Sentence: She could envisage a bright future for her business with the new marketing strategy.





#### 8. Muddled (Adjective): उलझा हुआ

Meaning: Confused or mixed up, not clear or well-organized

Synonyms: Confused, Jumbled, Befuddled, Disordered

**Antonyms: Clear, Organized, Orderly, Coherent** 

Sentence: The muddled instructions made it difficult for the students to complete the assignment correctly.



9. Rechristen (Verb) : नया नाम देना

Meaning: To give a new name to something or someone

Synonyms: Rename, retitle, relabel

Sentence: The company decided to rechristen itself to better reflect its expanded services.



10. Put The Card Before The Horse (Idiom)

Meaning: to do things in the wrong order, or to prioritize things incorrectly.

Synonyms: to reverse the order, to get things backward

**Antonym: to prioritize correctly** 

Sentence: Aren't you putting the cart before the horse by deciding what to wear for the wedding before you've even been invited to it?








Meaning: enigmatic means mysterious or obscure, therefore obvious is the opposite Solution: 4. obvious
