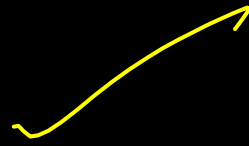

obsessive or uncontrollable desires or habits of smoking
one or more tobacco products (especially cigarettes; but
they may include cigars, pipes, etc.)



dipsomania – ✓

irresistible craving for alcoholic drinks

egomania – ✓

intense love for oneself

homicidomania – ✓

irresistible impulse to commit murder

kleptomania – ✓

someone desperate to steal something without economic motive

mythomania – ✓

an excessive or abnormal propensity for lying and exaggerating

netomania – ✓

irresistible impulse for internet

poriomania – ✓

a morbid impulse to wander or journey away from home

pyromania – ✓

obsession for playing with fire
(pyro means fire as in pyrometer, pyrotechnics)

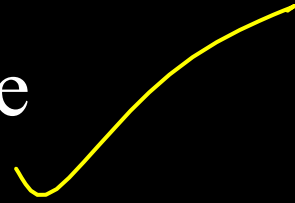

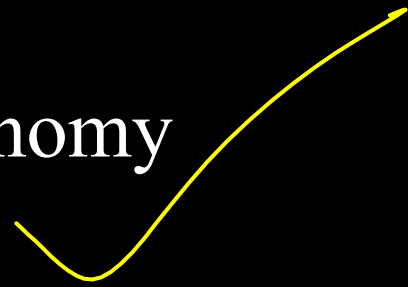
