





OMINOUSLY(ADVERB)

Meaning: to <u>describe an action or manner that</u> suggests something bad, threatening, or foreboding is about to happen.

Synonym: Menacingly, threateningly, forebodingly,

portentously

Antonym: <u>Reassuringly</u>, <u>optimistically</u>, cheerfully, hopefully

Example Sentence: The CEO's announcement about potential layoffs hung ominously in the air, causing anxiety among the employees.

IMPERILLED(ADJ.)

Meaning: being in danger, at risk, or facing a threat to safety or well-being.

Synonyms: Endangered, jeopardized, at risk,

threatened precarious

Antonyms: Safe, secure, protected, out of danger, unharmed

Example Sentence:

The imperilled species of birds faced extinction due to

habitat loss and environmental changes.

ABROGATION(noun)

Meaning: The act of repealing, abolishing, or formally putting an end to a law, agreement, custom, or right

Synonyms: Repeal, annulment, revocation,

nullification, cancellation

Antonyms: Confirmation, endorsement, approval,

ratification, enactment

Example Sentence: The abrogation of the outdated

policy paved the way for a more inclusive and

equitable approach.





AUDACIOUS (adj.)

Meaning: someone or something that is bold, daring, or fearless, often with a willingness to take risks or engage in actions that others might find surprising or unconventional. Synonyms: Bold, daring, fearless, courageous, adventurous, Antonyms: Cautious, timid, reserved, fearful, conservative **Example Sentence:** Her audacious plan to start her own business at such a young age impressed many in the industry.

LEGITIMISE (VERB)

Meaning: To make something legal, valid, or acceptable

according to established rules or standards.

Synonyms: Validate, authorize, legitimize, legalize,

sanction

Antonyms: Invalidate, illegalize, prohibit, disallow

Example Sentence:

The government passed a law to legitimise the use of

certain medicinal herbs for therapeutic purposes.

UNCONSCIONABLE (ADJ.)

Meaning: something that is extremely unfair,

unreasonable, or morally unacceptable

Synonyms: Unfair, unjust, excessive, immoral, unethical

Antonyms: Fair, just, reasonable, conscionable, ethical

Example Sentence:

The company's decision to exploit child labor

was deemed unconscionable by human rights

advocates.

ENUNCIATE (VERB)

Meaning: to pronounce words or express ideas clearly

and distinctly.

Synonyms: Articulate, pronounce, express, state, vocalize

Antonyms: Mumble, slur, garble, muffle, stutter

Example Sentence:

It's important to enunciate your words when

speaking in public to ensure that your message is

understood by the audience.

ENVISAGE (VERB)

Meaning: to contemplate, visualize, or foresee something

in the future.

Synonyms: Contemplate, visualize, imagine, foresee,

picture

Antonyms: Disregard, ignore, overlook, neglect, forget

Example Sentence:

She could hardly envisage the challenges that awaited

her on the adventurous journey.

PECULIAR (ADJ.)

Meaning: It often refers to something unusual, strange, or distinctive in a way that is different from what is normal or expected. Synonyms: Odd, strange, unique, distinct, unusual Antonyms: Common, typical, ordinary, familiar,

conventional

Example Sentence: The peculiar sound coming

from the old house at night made the

neighborhood residents uneasy.
