CARNAGE

Parts of Speech : **Noun**

Meaning : **the widespread and often gruesome slaughter or the killing of a large number of people or animals**

Synonyms : **Slaughter , Butchery**

Antonyms : **Order , Safety**

Sentence : **The riot led to a night of absolute carnage in the city, with businesses and homes vandalized and looted.**



SCANT

Parts of Speech : **Adj. , Verb**

Meaning : **To provide or supply something in limited or insufficient quantities , limited in quantity**

shortage*

Synonyms : **Limit, restrict, skimp**

Antonyms : **plentiful, ample, generous**

Sentence : **The organization decided to scant the budget for the project, resulting in some compromises on quality.**



APERTURE

Parts of Speech : **Noun**

Meaning : **opening or entrance.**

Synonyms : **Orifice, Slot**

Antonyms : **Blockage**

Sentence : **The camera's aperture can be adjusted to control the amount of light that reaches the sensor, allowing for creative control over the depth of field.**



BEGETS

Parts of Speech : **Verb**

Meaning : **to give rise to, produce, or cause the existence of something**

Synonyms : **Sire , Generate**

Antonyms : **Halt , Stifle**

Sentence : **It's said that adversity can beget resilience and strength in individuals who face it with determination.**



INSIDIOUS

Meaning : **something that proceeds in a hidden or deceitful manner, potentially causing harm over time.**

Synonyms: **Crafty , Stealthy**

Antonyms: **Honest , Transparent**

POS : **Adj.**

Sentence : **The disease had an insidious onset, with mild symptoms that gradually worsened over time, making it difficult to diagnose in the early stages.**



Mask

MASQUERADING

Meaning : **the act of disguising or concealing one's identity or true intentions by wearing a mask or adopting a false appearance or role**

Synonyms: **Camouflaging , Feigning**

Antonyms: **Authentic , Genuine**

POS : **Verb**

Sentence : **His cheerful demeanor was merely a mask, masquerading the pain he felt after the loss of his loved one.**



NONAGENARIAN

90-99
Year old

Meaning : **a person who is between the ages of 90 and 99 years old. It is a term used to describe individuals in their nineties.**

POS : **Noun**

Sentence : **The centenarian shared her memories of being a nonagenarian, recalling the events and changes she had witnessed throughout the years.**

Preposition

COMMENSURATE

Meaning : **two things are in proportion or appropriate to each other in some way.**

Synonyms: **Equivalent , Corresponding**

Antonyms: **Unequal , Inadequate**

POS : **Adj.**

Sentence : **It's important for the rewards to be commensurate with the effort and performance put into the project.**



ABORIGINAL

Meaning : an indigenous or native inhabitant of a region.

Synonyms: **Autochthonous , Original**

Antonyms: **Immigrant , Imported**

POS : **Adj. , Noun**

Sentence : The aboriginals of Canada have a deep spiritual connection with the land.

The artist draws inspiration from aboriginal art and symbolism in her paintings.
