Chandrayaan-3 reveals dark side of the moon



Ahead of the scheduled landing of the Chandrayaan-3 lander on the moon on Wednesday, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) on Monday released images of the far side of the lunar surface.

The far side is also known as the dark side of the moon as it is always hidden from earth. The images were captured on August 19 by the Lander Hazard Detection and Avoidance Camera (LHDAC) onboard the lander. "This camera that assists in locating a safe landing area /- without boulders or deep trenches. - during the descent is developed by ISRO at SAC," the space agency posted on X (formerly Twitter).

Russia's Luna-25, which

crashed into the moon on Sunday, had sent images of the far side of the moon.

The ISRO has already released three videos of the poon captured by Chandrayaan-3.

While one of them was taken by the Lander Position Detection Camera (LPDC) on August 15, another was taken by the Lander Imager (LI) Camera-1 just after the separation of the lander module from the propulsion module on August 17. On August 6, it shared the first video of the moon as viewed by Chandrayaan-3 during the Lunar Orbit Insertion on August 5.

One arrested after mob attacks Christian prayer meet in GTB Enclave

NEW DELHI

The police on Monday arrested one person, a day after a mob disrupted a Christian prayer meeting in Shahdara's GTB Enclave in east Delhi.

A senior officer said a mob of about 15 people interrupted the prayer meeting on Sunday morning, which was being held at a prayer hall inside a private residence in Tahirpur, where around 30 people were present.

"The mob had brought along musical instruments and loudspeakers to disrupt the prayer, which led to a scuffle between the two sides," the officer said, adding that two to three persons attending the prayer meeting sustained minor injuries.

"We have arrested one

Nothing like this ever happened to us before. How are we supposed to live here with this fear, asked the event organiser

FIR, but the mob was definitely much larger. Around 11 a.m., they forcibly entered the prayer hall with a loudspeaker and microphone, and started playing religious music. They were also chanting some religious slogans," he said.

'Hit us with sticks'

Mr. Bhati said, "They said that India is now a Hindu nation and asked us why we were holding the prayer meeting. Some of us asked them to sit down and talk, but they started hitting us with sticks and chairs."

FIFA Women's World Cup was a showcase for women's sporting events

very global women's sports competition is more than just a mere sporting spectacle. The FIFA Women's World Cup, which ended on Sunday following Spain's narrow 1-0 victory over England, forms a crucial part of this movement. Under the dazzling Sydney night sky, a whopping 75,784 fans at Stadium Australia witnessed Spain lift its maiden World Cup to join Germany as one of only two nations to have secured both the men's and women's titles. The Guardian reported that an average of 30,000 fans attended each match over the course of a month in Australia and New Zealand and nearly two million tickets - a record - were bought. These are astonishing numbers for a standalone women's event, the kind of which has suffered from administrator and spectator apathy in the past. Much of it was down to the on-field excellence, with the likes of Spain's Aitana Bonmati, the player of the tournament, Olga Carmona, who scored the winning goals for Spain in both the semifinal and final, Japan's Hinata Miyazawa, the highest goal-scorer (5), and England's Mary Earps, the best goalkeeper, mesmerising the audience.



The World Cup also showcased the wide geographic spread of women's football. Where nations from Europe and South America have been the hegemonic forces among men, in the short nine-edition history of the women's event, only four times have the winners come from these two regions - Germany twice, Norway and now Spain. In 2023, Germany, apart from being upset by Colombia, crashed out in the group stage. Japan, the 2011 world champion, hammered eventual winner Spain 4-0 in the preliminary round. Morocco made history by qualifying for the round of 16 while hosts Australia's fourth-place finish was its best ever. Four-time champion United States of America, marshalled by the retiring star Megan Rapinoe, missed the podium for the

nce again, New Delhi is back in the thick of global geopolitics of things – chairing summits, navigating tricky Manichaean choices, ducking geopolitical whirlwinds, and negotiating a place at the high table of global governance. The upcoming BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa) summit in South Africa, from August 22 to August 24, will be an important stress test for Indian diplomacy, and a harbinger of the shape of geopolitics to come.

The China question

The question that New Delhi must ask every step of the way as it pursues a multipolar world and alternative mechanisms for global governance is whether (or not) it helps boost the rise of China globally. No doubt, a multi-polar world requires strong, alternative global forums, and perhaps even attempts at de-dollarisation. But those very forums will go on to aid the rise of China and the strengthening of the yuan. To think de-dollarisation would lead to strengthening of the rupee is delusional as is the belief that China and India share larger geopolitical interests. They may find value in the instrumental utility of non-western institutions, but their end goals are fundamentally divergent. Given its size, economic influence and the spread of the Belt and Road Initiative and diplomatic bandwidth, China will influence an expanded BRICS; and India, with its limited resources, would struggle to match this. Paradoxically, and perhaps tragically, the more India helps strengthen non-western institutions and frameworks, thereby weakening the post-Second World War order, the more it helps, albeit indirectly, China's revisionist agenda. The challenge before India is to choose between a China-centric world order or a West-centric world order, or balance the two. If the latter is too preach, for India, the former is too Machiavellian. And balancing is going to get tougher.


